# Deadline over, shops stay

Lives of thousands of Old Dhaka residents still remain under constant threat as traders in the area continue to store and sell combustible chemicals defying government orders.

Against the backdrop of a devastating fire at Nimtoli on June 3, the government banned storage of combustible chemicals in Old Dhaka and directed the traders to move their stocks to a safer location by August 17.

Following requests from the traders the government later extended the deadline, which expired yesterday.

Since the Nimtoli inferno, two fresh fire incidents took the lives of seven people at warehouses in Lalbagh and Bangshal areas. A probe revealed that the Nimtali blaze, which claimed at least 124 lives, originated from a chemical warehouse.

Visiting different locations in the area yesterday, this correspondent found traders selling flammable chemical products at their stores.

"We have not seen anybody [traders] shifting their flammable


