Frame farmer-friendly agri policy

Speakers tell consultation meeting

Speakers at a national consultation meeting yesterday stressed the need for formulating a farmer-friendly agriculture policy incorporating recommendations of the growers to ensure effective development of agriculture sector.

The consultation meeting titled "Proposals on farmers-friendly agriculture policy" was organised by Incidin Bangladesh, a research organisation, in cooperation with the Manusher Jonno Foundation (MJF) at the National Press Club in the city.

Representatives from different political parties, labour organisations, non-government organisations and media attended the meet-

They said opinions of marginal farmers would be vital in formulating an effective agriculture policy. They stressed improvement of the condition

Land reform, strong agriculture

fertiliser, diesel and power should also be taken into consideration for development of agriculture, they said.

Speaking as the chief guest, Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Agriculture Ministry Shawkat Momen Shajahan said the government is sincere in agriculture production.

He said the government is working to increase use of surface water and made fertiliser more accessible and less expensive.

Farmland and industrial land have been identified across the country, he said, adding that the government is preparing a new law to ensure that agriculture land is not used for nonfarm purposes.

Executive Director of Incidin Bangladesh AKM Masud Ali presented the keynote paper at the consultation while Abdullah Zafr moderated the programme.

Van-puller murdered in Khulna



2 factories fined for pollution

The Department of Environment (DoE) yesterday fined two factories a total of Tk 52 lakh for discharging untreated liquid waste in the Shitalakkhya.

The two factories, Falcon Tex Limited in Kanchpur and Empire Dyeing Limited in Siddhirganj were fined Tk 20 lakh and Tk 33 lakh respectively for operating without setting up

effluent treatment plants (ETP). The DoE had warned the factories earlier that unless they set up ETPs immediately and complied with the environmental regulations, their gas, power and water supply would be severed. None of them had been issued clear-

ance certificate by the DoE. However, in spite of the warnings, the mills continued discharging untreated liquid waste in a nearby drain that ultimately ended up in

the Shitalakkhya. The mills have so far emptied almost 260,000 cubic metres of impurities into the river, according to an estimation of the mobile team of DoE officials.

During the drive, led by Mohammed Munir Chowdhury, director of Enforcement and Monitoring unit of the department, the team found red and yellow coloured untreated toxic waste being discharged from Empire Dyeing Limited.

The Narayanganj Police and officials of Palli Bidyut Samity also participated in the crackdown. ETPs are used to treat water that has been

contaminated by either industrial or commercial activities prior to its release into the envi-

ronment or its re-use. Meanwhile, the mobile team disconnected power supply to Imam Poultry Farm in Nayabari of Sonargaon for operating without an Environment Clearance Certificate.

Expelled AL leader killed in 'shootout' with Rab

An expelled leader of the ruling Awami League (AL) was killed in a 'shootout' with Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) at Bastuhara in Dumuria upazila of Khulna yesterday.

Rab Sub-inspector Haridas Mazumder also sustained bullet injuries during the 'gunfight', Rab claimed.

The deceased was identified as Kazi Fazlur Rahman alias Mohabbat.

He was accused of several criminal charges including freedom fighter Altaf Hossain killing charge.

Mohabbat was expelled from the post of cultural affairs secretary of Khalishpur upazila unit of AL for his alleged involvement with the killing of

Jahanara Begum, wife of Altaf, filed a murder case with Khalishpur police station one day after he was stabbed to death in front of his Khalishpur residence on May

Lt Col Mohammad Shoaib of Rab-6 said a Rab patrol team showed signal to Mohabbat to stop his motorbike at about 3:00am. Mohabbat was returning to Khulna city from Dumuria accompanied by two of his accomplices.

At one stage, they opened fire on the law enforcers that triggered a 'gunfight'.

Mohabbat was caught in the line of fire while two of his accomplices managed to flee.

Later, Rab recovered one 9mm pistol, one LG and one bullet from the spot.
