# Biman's risky NY venture

Plans to resume flight despite fear of losses

Biman is likely to resume its New York flight apparently to meet the government pledge despite fears of losses again due to tough competition on the transatlantic routes, insiders

Though the airliner carried a relatively good

number of passengers last time, it counted between Tk 35-40 lakh loss on each flight mainly because of using fuel-guzzling ageing DC-10 aircraft.

York along with Brussels, Paris, Frankfurt, Mumbai, Narita and Yangon in the wake of aircraft shortage and a record loss of Tk 454 crore in 2005-06 fiscal year. The state-owned carrier now says it wants to

use a hired Boeing 777-200ER aircraft to carry passengers on Dhaka-Manchester-New York route twice a week. Officials say the Boeing 777-200 ER aircraft

has relatively high-fuel efficiency and may help reduce fuel costs.

But chances of losses are still there, they add.

"We foresee a tough competition and intense fare war as almost all the globally known airlines operate on transatlantic routes. So there is a chance of losses, though we'll use fuel efficient aircraft," Jamal Uddin Ahmed, chairman of the Biman Board of Directors, told The Daily Star over the phone.

The only hope for Biman is the movement of non-resident Bangladeshis (NRBs).

The state-owned airliner fears losses by flying to New York at a time when it tries to remain in the black by shaking off the past Biman in August 2006 shut its flights to New marked by losses. After posting losses in three consecutive years, the airline recorded a profit of Tk 5.91 crore in 2007-08 FY.

Its net profit shot up to Tk 15.58 crore in 2008-09, according to Bangladesh Economic Review.

Insiders say the airliner plans to reopen flights on loss-incurring Dhaka-New York route in line with the promise of the current government to NRBs, who had been demanding air link between the two cities.

Early this week, Prime Minister Sheikh

### Local govt bodies limp

Constitutional obligation to promote the system ignored; people's participation in all administrative tiers remains a far cry

Despite constitutional backing, local government bodies have made little progress in around four decades since independence.

While political governments ignored the constitutional obligation to promote local governance, military rulers abused the system to gain power base at the grassroots level.

And all these years, the bureaucracy has been controlling almost everything regarding management of local affairs.

The present state of local government

institutions shows how the country has failed to be a democratic state as espoused in the original constitution, which took effect on December 16, 1972.

One of the fundamental principles of state policy in 1972's constitution said Bangladesh shall be a democracy with people participating in administration at all levels through elected representatives.

How to implement that principle was

outlined in articles 59 and 60.

But in 1975, the fourth amendment to the constitution introduced one-party rule under Baksal (Bangladesh Krishak Sramik Awami League) and deleted the provisions on local government.

It also had the traditional local government system supplanted by party machinery.

As per the amended charter, the government led by Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman formed district administrative councils with representatives from Baksal and front organisations.

#### Fire at city high-rise

## India calm after Ayodhya verdict

Schools, shops and businesses reopened yesterday as fears of violence ebbed in northern India following a court order to divide a disputed holy site between the Hindu and Muslim communities.

Thousands of government forces remained in the streets and on high alert, but the decision Thursday offered at least a reprieve in a battle over the site that has sparked deadly rioting in the past.

With both Muslim and Hindu lawyers vowing to appeal to the Supreme Court, public reaction to the verdict was restrained.

"The law and situation throughout the country has been extremely peaceful," India's Home Minister Palaniappan Chidambaram said. "There have been no incidents reported to
