Germany reunited--in the eyes of an ambassador

arrived in Bonn on a wintry day in October, 1992 to take up my duties as Ambassador of Bangladesh to Germany. I was earlier posted in Dhaka at our Foreign Ministry and had followed the historic developments in Germany leading up to reunification in the news media and through dispatches sent by our embassies in Bonn and East Berlin. I was therefore quite ready to meet a reunited, vibrant and confident Germany.

My introduction to Bonn, Berlin and Frankfurt was mainly through the writings of Syed Mujtaba Ali, a Bengali writer and I was looking forward to meeting Germany now for the first time. I of course had read about the poet Rabindranath Tagore's fascination with Goethe and Germany. Tagore had visited Germany many times and had been received with great honour, love and affection by the German people.

Bonn was just as I had expected but its efficiency and small-town charm were breathtaking. As I started my work I was waiting for the day when I would visit Berlin. The opportunity soon came in the summer of 1993 in the form of the World Tourism Festival. I took a train to Berlin from Bonn. As the train started, I asked the lady-conductor if she would let me know when the train crossed into former East Germany. The conductor said I would know myself but she would come anyway, perhaps a minute later. And lo and behold our train slowed down and we started our journey through former eastern Germany. The railway stations were dilapidated and in shambles- the countryside in disarray- quite a far-cry from the picturesque Western Germany. I learnt that the German Railway was laying a new track so that the high-speed trains could continue at the same speed

as in the western part. In Berlin I booked into a hotel in the western part of Berlin and went on a sight-seeing tour of the eastern part of Berlin afterwards. The story was the same again. There were a lot of matchbox towers built during the Soviet era. A year later the seat of the German presidency was shifted to Berlin and the President started holding the New Year reception for the Diplomatic Corps in Berlin. The German Foreign Office took all the Ambassadors to Berlin in a jumbo airbus for the occasion for a day trip. We were told by the Mayor of Berlin that all the buildings built after 1945 which were not in the German tradition would be pulled down and new structures in accordance with German

architectural heritage would be built. During my first visit to Berlin watched out for a Trabant car and could see one after a great deal of effort. We learnt that American tourists were snapping up these "Trabi"s as they called them and were taking them to the United States as reminders of a bygone era. It was difficult to imagine that Germany which produced the world's best cars such as Mercedes, BMW, Porsche, and Volkswagen also pro-

duced Trabant. During my tour of duty I had many occasions to visit the five eastern states and see the feverish activity that was going on to bring them at par with Western Germany. In fact the German government was pouring in about US\$ 50 billion per year to rebuild Eastern Germany. It was a fascinating sight. While on a visit to Dresden, Saxony, made a comment to the effect that a number of great composers came from Saxony which only confirmed that the German people were one and the same and the artificial division would be overcome in no time.

In 1994 I organized a paintings exhibition of Bangladeshi painters in Germany. The show started in Bonn at the German parliamentary association's dining room and moved to Bremen, Kassel, Hamburg, Munich with a grand finale in Berlin. It was a great success and the Berlin show especially brought together our friends and sympathizers from both sides of



Berlin. In fact by the time I left Germany towards the end of 1995 the dividing line of Berlin had started to become blurred and Berlin once again was becoming the capital of the great German people.

and sympathy of Chancellor Willy Brandt and the people of the Federal Republic of Germany during our

Liberation War in 1971. Similarly I recall the support of the people of the German Democratic Republic for our Liberation War as well as for the treatment of our injured freedom fighters in 1972. Today, I am so happy I recall with gratitude the support to find that a reunited Germany is working relentlessly to establish the place that it deserves in Europe and the

world and make its contribution for

democracy, human rights and development in the whole world.

Mr. A.H. Mahmood Ali served as Bangladesh's Ambassador to Germany from October, 1992 to December, 1995. He is now a Member of the Bangladesh Parliament and Chairman, Parliamentary Standing Committee on the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.


