Recruitment in 9 dists stopped

Corruption, irregularities alleged

The government has suspended the recruitment of the class-III and class-IV employees for health department in nine districts for alleged political influence, corruption and irregularities in the process.

Gaibandha, Shariatpur, Brahmanbaria, Jessore, Panchagar, Pirojpur and Jhenidah.

Health and Family Welfare Minister AFM Ruhal Haque told The Daily Star yesterday, "After receiving complaints from local level, we halted the procedure for few days. We are now reviewing the process to overcome the irregularities and mismanagement."

The districts where recruitment has already been completed will not come under the review. Rather it is only for the districts which faced problems, added the minister.

He also mentioned that the government formed district level investigation committees to scrutinise the issue.

The government has moved to recruit 4,217 class-III and class-IV employees for 79 health

complexes, medical college hospitals and civil surgeon offices in all 64 districts, said Dr Md Abul Hasnat, director (administration) of Directorate General of Health Services.

A total of 1,074 employees will be recruited in class-III and 3,143 in class-IV categories.

DGHS Director General Dr Shah Monir The districts are Gopalganj, Rangpur, yesterday said, "We will take the decision on the recruitment process after the health minister returns home from a trip to the US."

> Recruitment is a continuous process and some of them were suspended where the deprived and failed candidates tried to create chaos in the civil surgeons' offices, said the DG, adding that they were trying to make the staffing process more transparent.

> Dr Rafiqul Islam, civil surgeon of Gaibandha, told The Daily Star yesterday that 65 out of 68 employees already joined during the last two days. "We just saw the media reports about the suspension, but we are yet to receive any official instruction either from the ministry or from DGHS."

JS passes bill on quick energy deals

Parliament yesterday passed a bill for introduction of a new law providing the government with sweeping authority to quickly award energy sector contracts on unsolicited negotiation basis.

On consent of the president to the bill passed, it will have effect as law that also precludes the court's jurisdiction to review actions done under this law.

The new legislation styled Power and Energy Fast Supply Enhancement (Special Provision) Act, 2010 empowers the government with

authority to take and implement any projects for quick generation, distribution and marketing of power and gas for next two years.

"All acts done or purported to have been done, actions taken or orders made under this law shall not be called in question in any court," says a provision of the bill.

In defence of introducing the special law, State Minister for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources Enamul Haque, who yesterday proposed for passage of the bill, pointed to the country's acute shortage of power and gas.

Court's decision HC issues rule on **BGMEA** building

Asks authorities why it should not be demolished

The High Court yesterday issued a suo moto rule upon the authorities concerned asking them to explain within two weeks why they should not be directed to demolish Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA) building at Hatirjheel in the city.

A divisional bench comprised of Justice Zubayer Rahman Chowdhury and Justice Farah Mahbub issued the rule following a report published in the daily New Age on October 2 stating that the building was constructed without any approval from Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk). Advocate GHM Muniruddin yesterday placed the news item

before the HC bench, and told the court that BGMEA building was illegally built.
