Free Lalbagh Kella from encroachers

Demand environmental activists

Environmental activists yesterday demanded immediate steps to free Lalbagh Kella, a historic fort in Old Dhaka, from the grips of encroachers.

They also urged the authorities concerned to take stern action against the encroachers. The demands came from a human chain organised by Poribesh Bachao Andolon (POBA) in front of the main gate of the fort.

The fort represents Dhaka and hence is a pride for the city

dwellers, speakers told the programme. Once the fort had 18 acres of land, but now it is 17.35 acres,

cited the speakers adding that houses, built in the western part of the fort, are illegal as per the main design of the fort. They mentioned that about 30 houses around the fort were

built without permission from authorities concerned. They urged the government to take steps to remove all illegal structures surrounding the fort to save the precious historic site

of Bangladesh. The environmental activists also demanded that an expert team should be formed for the renovation of the fort and moving

of vehicles around the fort should be banned.

Prof Shamshul Wares of POBA presided over the programme that was attended among others by CPB President Manjurul Ahsan Khan, POBA Chairman Abu Naser Khan, Prof Nisar Begum and artiste Golam Mohammad Idu.

President asks EC to maintain neutrality

President Zillur Rahman yesterday called upon the Election Commission (EC) to maintain utmost transparency and neutrality in holding national and other local body elections in the country.

The president made the call when Chief Election Commissioner ATM Shamsul Huda with the two other Election Commissioners called on him at Bangabhaban and handed over the Bangladesh map showing the newly delimited constituencies.

Election Commissioners Muhammed Sohul Hussain and Brig Gen (retd) M Sakhawat Hossain accompanied the CEC.

During the meeting, the president said that an independent Election Commission (EC) could play a significant role in developing and institutionalising democracy in the country.

He expressed the hope that the EC would discharge its duties reflecting the people's welfare and expectation.

The EC has currently delimited the constituencies to remove the anomalies in the number of voters.

According to the Constitution, the whole country was earlier divided into 300 constituencies but there was huge difference in number of voters in many parliamentary con-

The EC has now demarcated the constituencies keeping the number of voters at rational levels.

The president lauded the EC for completing the delimitation task with a sense of responsibility.

Int'l Mother Language Day Monument built in Italy
