Rangamati townspeople deprived of civic amenities

SHANTIMOY CHAKMA, Rangamati

Rangamati Municipality with 64.75 square kilometre area and about two lakh inhabitants is plagued with multifarious problems for long.

Although Rangamati Municipality was upgraded to 'A' category in 1998, it has failed to ensure adequate civic amenities for the town dwellers.

Inadequate supply of safe drinking water, lack of sewerage system and public toilets, lack of separate shed for slaughtering animals, insufficient street lights, inadequate recreation park, narrow roads and insufficient space for graveyard are some of the problems affecting the resi-

Rangamati Municipality Mayor Habibur Rahman, who was elected twice, said, "I am working relentlessly to ensure all kinds of civic amenities for my townspeople."

He, however, said the authority cannot construct public toilets due to lack of

The mayor blamed the local 'bazar fund' authority as it often interferes with municipality works, especially during land selection for construction of public toilets.

"Many times we informed the mayor about the urgency of repair of the public toilet at Tabalchhari Bazar. We also submitted an application for the same but no step has been taken," said Zahir Ahmad Sawdagor, president of Tabalchhari Bazar

"On the basis of routine work, our staff often clean existing public toilets," said Mayor Habibur Rahman.

Twenty public toilets were earlier set up in the municipality area but most of those were removed after two to three years of construction due to 'unknown reasons'.

Ramiz Ahmad, a member of the Bazar Committee at Tabalchhari, said there was a public toilet for women at Tabalchhari Bazar, which was removed four months

Tourists, pedestrians, women, children, elderly people, small shopkeepers and people of low income group like auto-rickshaw drivers, day labourers, hawkers are facing problems due to inadequate public toilet.

Kazi Nazrul Islam, a former chairman of Rangamati Pourasabha, said adequate public toilets along with other civic amenities that were available when Rangamati was a third or second class municipality, are now absent.

Due to lack of sewerage drains, human wastes and garbage of the municipality are thrown directly into the Kaptai Lake everyday.

The inhabitants often face crisis of safe drinking water as the municipality authority failed to set up sufficient potable water points. Most of the municipality dwellers have installed deep tube-well at

Moreover, most of the areas become dark soon after evening due to absence of streetlights. The lone recreation park in the munic-

ipality area was leased out for nursery five years ago.

Power-hungry people block highway

Teachers oppose 'illegal' move Local people barricaded Dhaka-Mawa highway in front of Mawa Super Market under Louhajang upazila of the district for an hour yesterday demanding uninterrupted power supply in the area.

Sources said the agitated people blocked the highway for an hour from 9:45am and also held a rally protesting power outage in the area. The blockade created a huge tailback on the highway for hours.

The power-hungry people withdrew the blockade after local administration assured them of taking measures to

ensure power supply in the area. Earlier, the people of the area had barricaded the highway twice on the same demand, but to no effect. Mohadev Saha, one of the demonstrators, said they get electricity only for two to three hours a day.

250 houses, 50 shops damaged as storm hits Gaibandha, B'baria

At least 250 dwelling houses and 50 shops were damaged and ten people injured as storms lashed two upazilas of Gaibandha and Brahmanbaria district yesterday.

In Gaibandha, a storm accompanied by rain and gusty wind hit Sadar upazila of the district at around 4:30pm, damaging at least 250 houses and injuring seven people, reports our correspondent.

The storm that lasted for half an hour also uprooted a large number of trees and electric poles. Tin-made roofs

of many houses and some educational institutions were blown away.

Kholahati Union Parishad, said at least 200 dwelling houses in eight villages under his union were damaged by the storm. Chairman of Gidari Union

Parishad Anisur Rahman also claimed that the storm damaged over 50 houses in two villages under the union.

In Brahmanbaria, a violent

storm lashed Jinadpur Bazar in Nabinagar upazila at around 2:30pm, leaving at Seven people injured in least 50 shops and a school damaged and three people injured.

> Besides, a large number of trees and electric poles were uprooted by the storm. The injured--Nazrul Islam, 45, Nabi Hossain, 35, and another unidentified woman---were sent to Dhaka and upazila health complex.

Abdur Rouf, Chairman of Jinadpur Union Parishad, said the storm, which lasted for several minutes, left a trail of destruction in the area.

Gamblers attack cops in Rajshahi, 2 injured

Armed gamblers beat up two plainclothes policemen near a police camp set up at the district collectorate field here on Monday night.

Injured police constables---Farhad Hossain and Sona Miah---were admitted to Rajshahi Medical College and

Hospital with serious head collectorate field.

Police arrested 12 people, including gang leader Razzak Khan Tutul, early yesterday after Havildar Rezanul Haq of the police camp lodged a case with Rajpara Police Station.

The policemen came under attack at around 11:00pm when they went to a fair organised at the

Injured Sona Miah said the gamblers attacked them when they moved towards them to disperse an unusual gathering at the fair.

"Some of them swooped on Farhad and tore off his T-shirt. We managed to catch one of them and handed him over to the police camp," he added.

When they went out of the camp, about 20 gamblers equipped with bamboos and bricks attacked them. Hearing their screams, other police personnel of the camp rushed to the spot and rescued them.

Shahidul Islam, officer-incharge of Rajpara Police Station, said he was unaware about gambling at the fair. "We have started an investigation and arrested a number of people for their alleged involvement in the incident."

Clash at wedding party, one killed

One person was stabbed to death during a clash between two groups of people at a wedding party here on Monday night.

The victim was identified as Sagor Das, 19, son of Sanjib Das of Lauarkhil village under Patiya upazila of the district.

The clash ensued when relatives of the bride and bridegroom locked in an altercation over seat arrangement for the wedding feast at Diamond Community Centre near Bahodderhat intersection at around 11:00pm.

During the clash, Sagor received stab injuries in his chest and abdomen. He was rushed to the Chittagong Medical College and Hospital (CMCH) where he died at around 6:45am yesterday, said Sub-Inspector (SI) Arup Biswas of Panchlaish Police Station.
