# 14th Asian Art Biennale kicks off today

The 14th Asian Art Biennale 2010 begins today. As part of the festival, exhibitions will be held simultaneously at two venues -- National Art Gallery of Bangladesh Shillpakala Academy (BSA) and Osmani Memorial Hall. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will inaugurate the event at Osmani Memorial Hall today at 10 am.

BSA has been organising the biennale since 1981. Apart from Bangladesh, 26 countries are taking part with 300 artworks at the event.

Among the participating countries are Bahrain, Brunei, China, India, Indonesia, Iran, Japan, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Lebanon, Malaysia, Maldives, Nepal, Oman, Pakistan, South and North Korea, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Syria, Thailand, Philippines, Turkey, the United Arab Emirates and Uzbekistan.

BSA held a press conference yesterday at its Seminar Hall to inform the media on the festival. Hedayetullah Al Mamun,

Cultural Affairs, was present as chief guest at the conference. Kamal Lohani, director general of BSA, presided over the

secretary to the Ministry of meeting. Mushfique Ahmed Shamim, director of the Department of Fine Arts, BSA, gave a brief speech on the

Mushfique Ahmed Shamim said, "The Asian Art Biennale is one of the largest art festivals in our sub-continent. Artists, critics, gallery owners

and art connoisseurs eagerly wait for the festival. BSA is delighted to be able to hold an event on a grand scale. Almost thirty guests from overseas have reached Dhaka so far to attend the festival. A number of observers and critics from the US, Canada and Germany are also in Dhaka. They will visit the local galleries and will make observations on our art market and scenario. A fivemember jury committee, including veteran Bangladeshi painters and critics, have selected the artworks for the exhibition. Another jury committee will select the winners of three Grand Prizes and Honourable Mention Award."

"Other highlights of the biennale include a two-day long seminar titled 'Contemporary Asian Art: New Realities, New Space'. The seminar will be held on October 9 and 10 at the National Music and Dance Auditorium of BSA," Shamim added.

The festival will continue till November 6.

## SM Solaiman Scholarship to be awarded today

'SM Solaiman Motivation Scholarship', conferred by Theatre Art Unit, will be presented today (October 8) at Experimental Theatre Hall of Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA), according to a press release.

Director general of BSA Kamal Lohani and President of ITI Worldwide Ramendu Majumdar will present the scholarships, with honorary emblems, to two promising theatre activists Shahadat Hossain of Centre for Asian Theatre (CAT) and Anwarul Haque of Udichi. They will receive the scholarships for the year 2009 and 2010 respectively.

Professor Ratan Siddiqui will deliver the SM Solaiman memorial speech at the event.

Shahadat Hossain first appeared on stage in the production "Ekhono Juddho" of

Bandhu Natyadol in 1996. He joined CAT in 1998. As a member of CAT, Hossain has so far acted in a number of productions, including "The Communicator", "Bhelua Shundori" and "Raja." He directed four plays for CAT. He also acted in a BSA production "Eksho Bosta Chal".

Anwarul Haque joined Udichi in 1997. He contributes to his troupe through writing, directing, acting, and set designing. Haque acted in the productions "Half Akhrai", "Bou Bashonti" and "Chilekothar Shepai". Haque has written and directed the play "Drop Out", produced by Oikik


Theatre Art Unit will stage their production "Court Marshal" on the occasion.

### "Glee" beats Beatles' singles record



The cast of US TV show "Glee" have beaten The Beatles' record for the most appearances in the Billboard Hot 100 singles chart by a non-solo act.

Six new entries this week brings their total to 75 chart entries, compared with The Beatles' 71. Only Elvis Presley (108) and

James Brown (91) have scored more hits. "Glee" -- the story of a high

school choir of misfits -- has shifted 2.8 million albums and 11.5 million downloads, music sales tracker Nielsen SoundScan said.

The cast of "Glee" have also overtaken Ray Charles (74) and Aretha Franklin (73).

Songs from the TV show are released digitally after each episode is broadcast.

Five covers of Britney Spears songs debuted in the latest chart after last week's show. Amongst them was a version of the singer's UK number one "Toxic", which landed at 16, making it the show's highest new entry to

That track sold 109,000 downloads in its first week of release.

The Beatles' 71 hits were in the charts between 1964 and 1996, while Glee's first entry came in June 2009.

However, only 14 of Glee's Hot 100 hits have stayed in the chart for more than one week giving them a cumulative total of 105 weeks on the countdown.

By contrast, the fab four have a tally of 617 weeks in the chart.

For nine weeks between February and April 1964, they continuously held the top two positions and, on one of those weeks (April 4-10, 1964), they occupied the entire top five -the only act in chart history ever to do so.

## Business picks up for idol-makers

With Durga Puja around the corner, the

idol-makers of Pabna are a busy lot. "We are finishing off our work and completing orders," said veteran artisan Dhananjoy Kumar Pal, who is putting the final touches on the largest statue in Gopalpur village in Pabna. "Taka 40,000 is needed to make the statue," he said,

adding that the statue of the goddess is to be seated on an elephant this year.

Pal's business is always at its peak at this time of the year. "I have made statues for nine temples in the district headquarters. I am charging Taka 25,000-to 40,000 for each idol. Though the cost of inputs is steep this year, I get my highest returns on this occasion," he said. Like him over 100 idol-makers of the district are hopeful of raking in profits.

Meanwhile decorators too are optimistic about their business fortunes. "The decoration of high gates and the temples as well as bright lighting, attract viewers. We want to ensure the best quality decoration," said Mohammad Asad, who has linked up with the Shahid Paltu Club Puja Mandap of Gopalpur.

Shahid Paltu Club is the lone organisation that has been celebrating Durga Puja for the last 21 years in the district headquarters.

"Pradip Shannal Gopal, key organiser of the club, told The Daily Star that the club has been named after Paltu who was martyred during the Liberation War.

A meeting was held in Pabna municipality on October 4 to tie up loose ends so that the festival can be celebrated with gaiety. Chaired by Pabna Municipality Mayor Kamrul Hasan Mintu, the meeting had president of Pabna district Puja Udjapan Parishad, Ganesh Chandra Ghosh; secretary Binoy Jyoti Kundu and leaders of the local Hindu community.

Kundu said that the district administration has tightened up security for the festival and allotted 450 kg rice for each temple. Though this may be insufficient for the community, people are trying hard to celebrate Durga Puja with traditional festivity, he said.


