Shift policy to reduce carbon

Environmentalists urge govt

Environmental activists yesterday urged the government to make internal policy shift to reduce carbon emissions instead of borrowing money from external sources and throwing it around to be gobbled up by corrupt quarters.

Bangladesh Paribesh Andolon (BAPA) General Secretary Dr Mohammad Abdul Matin told this to a seminar titled '10:10:10 Global Work Party' at the Pan Pacific Sonargaon hotel in the city.

Bangladesh Information Gateway Ltd organised the event to join the global movement initiated by 350 organisations, an international campaign dedicated to building a movement to unite the world around solutions to the climate crisis.

"Borrowing and spreading money would not help us tackle the global warming issues. We need to borrow in a transparent way, otherwise the country will be buried under piles of debt," observed Matin.

The participants said the natural greenhouse gas absorbers, such as fresh water, non-contaminated soil and forests, should be put in place to combat global warming meaningfully.

A fair was also organised on the occasion, where around two dozens of stalls showcased ways to cut carbon emissions and alternative energy saving tools.

Odhikar organised it to mark the seventh world day against the death penalty and its sixteenth founding anniversary.

Inspector General of Police Hassan Mahmood Khandkar yesterday claimed that despite some 'sporadic incidents' like the one in Natore, the law and order across the country is satisfactory and under control.

He was briefing the media at the police headquarters on security arrangements for Durga Puja, the biggest religious festival of the Hindus.

The IGP said as the law and order is now better than in the past, the number of puja mandaps in the country this year has risen to around 26,000, which is about 4,000 more

than last year's. "The killing of Boraigram upazila chairman (in Natore) was a sporadic and unexpected incident. But the overall law and order is under control of the law enforcers, and is satisfactory," he said.

The police chief said 35,000 police and Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) personnel will

be deployed during the puja that begins on Wednesday across the country.

Security has been arranged for three phases-- pre-puja, puja and the day of immersion of Durga.

On the posting of two inspectors in each police station, Hassan Mahmood said this step was taken on the basis of rules and regulations to ensure better investigation, which is one of the major tasks of police.

The police authorities recently decided to post two inspectors in each police station across the country. Senior inspector will perform as officer-in-charge of the station.

Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) has already posted one more inspector each in 24 police stations in the capital.

The press briefing was also attended by Director General of Rab Moklesur Rahman DMP Commissioner AKM Shahidul Hoque, deputy inspector generals of all ranges and

A Dhaka court yesterday adjourned the hearing on charge framing for the fifth time against detained former state minister for home Lutfozzaman Babar in connection with a tax evasion case.

Meantime, the same court adjourned the hearing till November 21 against acting editor of the daily Amar Desh Mahmudur Rahman in con-

nection with a corruption case. Judge (In-charge) Mozammel Hossain of the Special Judge Court-5 fixed November 23 for hearing on charge framing after Babar's lawyer submitted a petition

seeking time. In the petition, Babar's lawyer said following an appeal challenging the legal basis of the case the HC issued a rule upon the government asking why the case against his client will not be declared illegal. The lawyer said he prayed for the adjournment since the rule hearing in the

HC is now pending. The National Board of Revenue (NBR) filed the case against Babar saying that he has evaded Tk 2.65 crore income tax from 1999-2000 fiscal year to 2008-09 fiscal year as director of Master Electronics Industries Limited.

CASE AGAINST MAHMUDUR The hearing on charge framing against Mahmudur was adjourned following a petition submitted by his lawyer. The petition said following a writ petition challenging the legality of the case by his client the High Court stayed the proceeding of the case for six months.

The NBR filed the case with Gulshan Police Station against former Board of Investment Chairman Mahmudur on June 13. He is in detention since

Earlier, he was sentenced for a six-month imprisonment in a contempt of court charge.
