PM assures all-out support for research

Inaugurates new Medical Research Council building

UNB, Dhaka

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday reiterated her government's pledge to extend all out support for research.

"Basically, Bangladesh is far behind in research. It's not possible to reach the optimum level in any sector without research. We'll provide all sorts of cooperation for research," she said while inaugurating the Bangladesh Medical Research Council (BMRC) building at Mohakhali in the city.

About the allocation for research works, Hasina said the researchers would just have to inform the government about their activities and the fund they need, and the government would allocate the fund.

"We don't suffer from dillydallying in releasing funds. This government is with you; we'll do whatever is needed," she told the researchers.

Hasina also urged the private sector to come forward in funding the research activities. In this regard, she said the pharmaceutical companies could invest in the medical research sector and the ultimate result of such investment would bring more profit for them.

The prime minister also called upon the physicians to expedite basic research activities in the country's health sector to provide quality

healthcare to the people.

"Now we need to improve the quality of health services along with expansion of medicare facilities across the country and that's why we need to put emphasis on research activities," she said.

Suggesting the physicians

to try to prevent diseases instead of providing treatment after the disease, Hasina underscored the need for strengthening basic research in the health sector to improve the quality of healthcare facilities alongside its extension.

She also emphasised

determining the actual need of the health workers and their necessary skills, method of treatments and amount of medicine through research in a particular area to ensure maximum utilisation of limited national resources.

She requested the physi-

cians not to be confined only to identifying diseases and innovative treatment methods but they should also try to improve the medical and health system and ensure its better use through proper restructuring of the system.

Body to probe question leakage

The ministry of education yesterday formed a three-member probe committee to investigate the allegation of question paper leakage of the test examination of School Secondary Certificate (SSC) exam spread in Dhaka and outside, says an official handout.

The members of the committee are AKM Jakir Hossain Bhuiyan, deputy secretary of the ministry of education, a representative of director general of the directorate of secondary and higher education, and a deputy exam controller of the board of intermediate and secondary education of Dhaka.

The committee will look into the flaws of the distribution of the question papers and submit its report by seven working days.

The allegation of question paper leakage of the test examina-tion was first raised in some schools in Comilla on last Saturday and then in some schools in the city and Bhola in the last three to four days ago.

Four Ctg factories fined for pollution

The Department of Environment (DoE) yesterday fined four factories Tk 47 lakh for polluting sea and river through discharging liquid wastages for years in Chittagong.

A DoE team led by Director (Enforcement) Munir Chowdhury penalised Mak Paper and Board Mills at Bayezid Bostami industrial area, and Seamark (BD) Ltd, Ifco Foods and Imam Buttons Industries Ltd at Sagorika industrial area.

Mak Paper was running without DoE clearance and effluent treatment plant (ETP) for 19 years while Seamark and Ifco for nine years, said Munir Chowdhury.

Imam Buttons was discharging the wastages for 15 years without setting ETP, despite having DoE clearance, he added.

Munir said untreated liquid wastages, around 150,000 cubicmetre, from the industries find their ways to the River Karnaphuli and the Bay through drains and canals.

Mak Paper was fined Tk 33.04 lakh, Seamark Tk 7.70 lakh, Imam ButtonTk5.41 lakh and IfcoTk 1.66 lakh.

The industries were asked to set up ETP immediately and the

DoE clearance of Imam Button was cancelled, said the director. Meanwhile, the team realised Tk 68 thousand from N Mohammad Plastic at Muradpur as arrears renewal fee. The industry was running without DoE clearance for 14 years, said Munir.



they said. The organisers noted that nearly 60 percent of commuting in the city takes place on foot. However, privileges for pedestrians remain unconsidered when transportation plans and policies are formulated.

Dhaka is probably the only city in the world where there are no zebra crossings despite the huge number of pedestrians, they said, adding that pavements and pedestrian zones must be commutable and easily accessible.
