MP's rally remarks upset probe, hunt

The hunt for the suspected killers of Baraigram upazila chairman Sanaullah Noor Babu suffered a huge setback after the local Awami League leaders at a rally on Wednesday warned the law enforcers of not raiding the houses of the accused.

Talking to The Daily Star, a number of police officials yesterday said the drive to arrest the accused has already been slowed down since the AL leaders also asked party men to tie up the law enforcers if they raid their houses.

"Such statements are very frustrating when police are making raids without much success, even after a week of the murder," mentioned a senior police officer, seeking anonymity.

He said the entire police force in Natore is now in dilemma about its role in Babu murder

"The words of the ruling party leaders will also hamper the investigation process," observed another police officer, admitting that police role here is already being questioned.

Local AL lawmaker (Baraigram-Gurudaspur) Abdul Quddus at a rally at Bonpara Bazar on Wednesday asked his party men, accused in Babu murder case, not to be worried. He blamed BNP for the killing and claimed no AL man was involved in it.

Sub-Inspector of Detective Branch (DB) of police Md Abdul Hannan, also the investigation office (IO) of the case, said he would carry on his duties.

1971 heroes hand over batons to new generation today

October 15, 1971. Thirty-eight young men from Bangladesh started marching towards Delhi from Bahrampur of Murshidabad in India.

The mission was to make the world aware of the Pakistani forces' atrocities on the people of Bangladesh during the Liberation War in 1971. The banner they carried inscribed "Biswa Bibek Jagoron Podojatra" (World Conscience Revival March).

NEW INSECT FOUND IN BANDARBAN

A new species of bush cricket has been found for the first time in Bangladesh by a team of "Prokriti O Jibon", a Channel I television series headed by Dr Anisuzzaman Khan and his associate Mushfiq Ahmed.

The brilliantly coloured cricket, Sanaa Imperialis falls under the family Tettigonioidea. It has been discovered at Bogakain Lake area of Bandarban in August. Its subfamily is Pseudophyllinae meaning "false leaf-like".

The team circulated the discovery in the global web portal "Wildlife Extra.com". Renowned entomologists Dr Powell **Ettinger, Dr Karim Vahed** and Dr Gary Bowers helped in the identification of the species. The Species is. The insect has a very impressive repose, used to scare predators.

Summit JV wins Bibiyana bid

Summit Industrial and Mercantile Corporation (Pvt) Ltd and its partner GE Energy LLC Bangladesh, a local joint venture company, yesterday turned out to be the lone responsive bidder for setting up the 300-450 megawatt gas-fired combined cycle Bibiyana power plant offering a very competitive price.

Sources said Summit offered a power tariff of US 3.32 cents per kilowatt hour for the project to be implemented under the Power Cell. This is the lowest offer in a power bid in the last six years and is considered a "stunning" price by the industry operators.

The price is much lower than that offered in the first tender for the Bibiyana project that was cancelled in 2008. That bid drew a lone offer of US 4.53 cents per kilowatt hour. Interestingly, Summit was controversially disqualified by the Power Cell at **SEE PAGE 15 COL 4**




