

As part of the 14th Asian Art Biennale 2010, National Museum has organised an exhibition of three legendary painters of the country-- Zainul Abedin, Quamrul Hassan and SM Sultan at Nalini Kanta Bhattashali Gallery of the museum. The exhibition features selected artworks from the collection of the museum. About 86 artworks are on display at the exhibition.

Zainul Abedin (1914-1976), Quamrul Hassan (1921-1988) and SM Sultan (1923-1994)-the three painters of Bangladesh were magnificent in their own fields. They

believed in nationalism, secularism and patriotism. They identified heart and soul with their motherland. All of them were recognised for their individual hallmark and created a distinct path in our art arena. Their artworks mainly feature rural people and their daily chores, riverine life, disadvantaged people, the beauty of nature, six seasons of Bangladesh, famine, Liberation War, and other themes. The painters used oil, gouache, ink, pen, wash, watercolour, wax, mixed media and poster colour in their works.

The exhibition was inaugurated on October 7 and will run till November 6.



Tapan Chowdhury:



journalist, is one of the 100 members of Grammy Awards Committee. Starting from October 2, the programme is




