REPORTED VIOLENCE Govt steps up vigilance in Hatia

STAR REPORT

The home ministry has directed the law enforcement agencies to intensify vigilance in the remote chars (shoals) of Hatia island in Noakhali following some reports on killing of char people in the hands of bandits.

Talking to The Daily Star yesterday, Home Secretary Abdus Sobhan Sikder said though there is no specific information of killings in the area, "We have asked the law enforcers to intensify their activities in the region."

Contacted, Noakhali Superintendent of Police Harunur Rashid Hazari said a person named Nizamuddin yesterday filed a case alleging abduction and killing of seven people in Hatia's Noler Char

"The seven missing persons are: Ibrahim Sardar, Kamaluddin, Rafiquddin, Afsaruddin, Dulaluddin, Belal Majhi and Md Khaleq," said

"Despite a combined drive conducted by police, Rab and Coastguard, so far, we have not found any trace of killing taking place there," he said last

Earlier in the day, home secretary confirmed that officials from a Coastguard base in Hatia have received no information of killing.

Residents of Janata Bazaar, Noler Char, Caring Char, Bhumihin Bazar also could not mention of any killing SEE PAGE 15 COL 2

Rubel Hossain's searing yorker uprooted New Zealand's long-standing bastion over the

Tigers and, like his raised fist, took his team into new heights in world cricket. The incredibly tight three-run win yesterday completed the much-coveted 4-0 whitewash of a major

Test-playing nation, an exceptional highlight for Bangladesh.

The series win, especially the result, took Bangladesh on a par with West Indies in the

#### AL, BNP on Khaleda's house

Amid mounting call from Awami League asking BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia to vacate the cantonment house as per the High Court judgement, BNP leader Salauddin Quader Chowdhury said politics or judiciary has nothing to do with it.

"The army will have to decide whether it will let the widow of a former army chief stay in that house," Quader, a standing committee member of the party, said.

He was addressing a press briefing at his Dhanmondi residence yesterday.

Quader said the army can "oust" Khaleda from the house even in three days if it wants, but the issue has no relation with politics, administration or judiciary.

Awami League presidium member Obaidul Quader, however, said involving army in it will be "unnecessary and embarrassing" for the force.

"...It's too late.... When the government issued the first notice, BNP could say it is a military affair and stand by that. BNP rather took the issue to the highest court," the AL policymaker said. When the High Court stayed

the government notice for threemonths, the BNP was joyous; and now when the same court declared the government notice valid, BNP leaders are refusing to accept it, he observed. BNP leader Lt Gen (retd)

Mahbubur Rahman, however, said army is not separated from the government.

### Bangladesh betters on hunger challenge

#### Moves to 6th place from 16th on the index

Bangladesh has ranked sixth in combating hunger among 28 vulnerable countries this year, an ActionAid International study said.

The country -- this year's most successful in reducing hunger rate among the south Asian countries -- was in the 13th spot last year. Brazil, China, Vietnam, Malawi and Ghana are the top rankers in this year's scorecard for tackling hunger.

The study, however, said that Bangladesh has one of the highest rates of underweight children and does not have sufficient food to feed almost half its population.

Marking the World Food Day, ActionAid International published the scorecard in its UK

based research titled "Who is Really Fighting Hunger". The ranking is decided on criteria such as hunger trends, legal framework, smallholder agriculture, social safety and gender equity.

Scoring 44 points, three points more than the last year, Bangladesh stands high above its neighbours Nepal (14th), India (21st) and Pakistan (25th) in the global scorecard.

"Bangladesh's rank reflects the progress it has made in reducing hunger from 36 percent to 26 percent since 1990," said the research.

The study, however, warned that Bangladesh has chances to lose the trend of hunger reduction, the primary Millennium Development Goal (MDG), due to the impact of

### Thorny border ties thaw

#### Dhaka, Delhi agree to construct road, bridge, fence in some areas within 150 yards of zero line

In line with a major policy decision taken erecting fences beyond the 150 yard zone. construction of approach roads in a few months back, Bangladesh and India both have begun construction of structures within 150 yards of the zero line along the international border at designated areas.

While this is a deviation from the Indo-Bangladesh Boundary Agreement 1974, on the parts of both countries, it is essentially addressing the needs of both too. The agreement restricts any construction within 150 yards of the zero line.

Bangladesh allowed India to erect fences at a dozen places having important establishments including religious installations that could not be dismantled due is also reciprocating by allowing

to the sensitive nature of those. Terrains at Bangladesh to construct a bridge in some of those places are also difficult for Laxmipur, expansion of a wall in Hili, India recently began construction of the Moulvibazar and Bhomra, and several

India also allowed Bangladesh to construct structures within 150 yards of the zero line at 11 points of the country.

The arrangement came following a proposal from India early last year. India had been seeking to erect such fences within 150 yards of the zero line at 46



other initiatives."

"Our mutual agreement has created a very positive environment. Both countries are now willing to resolve long standing minor issues," he said, "This will help boost border trade on both sides."

Following last year's Indian proposal, BDR inspected various border points the same year, and submitted clearance to the Bangladesh home ministry about 12 out of the 46 points. India and Bangladesh conducted combined surveys of these areas as well, the BDR DG said.
