Media language getting worse

Says Abdullah Abu Sayeed

Prof Abdullah Abu Sayeed, chairman of Bishwa Sahitya Kendra, yesterday said the language used by media is getting worse as journalists do not get opportunity to read books at libraries.

He was addressing a seminar styled "Journalism and library: Present context" at the National Press Club in the city to mark the 56th anniversary of the club.

The National Press Club recently took initiatives to renovate its library.

He suggested the club authorities to keep two divisions at the library -- one for reference and another for books on advanced knowl-

"I hope the library will help the country's journalists," he

Speakers at the seminar stressed the need for a library at every media house for journalists to enrich their knowledge and do better reporting.

News clippings and photos should be kept at the libraries so that newsmen can easily get background information about any particular incident, they said.

Supernumerary professor of the Department of Mass Communication and Journalism of Dhaka University Dr Shakhawat Ali Khan said more journalists would be able to improve their expertise in the profession if libraries are set up at the media houses. Veteran journalist ABM

Recover all children's parks: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has directed the authorities concerned to take immediate steps to recover all the children's parks and playgrounds in the city.

She also directed the ministry concerned to arrange sports tournaments among the children across the country.

The prime minister said her government has undertaken a number of steps to turn Bangladesh into a safe abode for children.

She vowed to establish a safe and prosperous Bangladesh for every child, saying that the present government will not allow any terrorism on the land of Bangladesh.

Sheikh Hasina has urged parents and teachers to shower as much love and affection as possible on their children and students respectively to help them build safe and beautiful lives.

She said love and affection can be more effective than strictness in the form of scold-

Extortionists torch 13 jhut warehouses in city

Extortionists allegedly torched at least 13 jhut (garment by-product) warehouses early yesterday after failing to collect tolls from its owner at capital's Kafrul area under Mirpur-13.

On information, four fire fighting units rushed to the spot at around 1:00am and doused the fire after more than half an hour's effort.

fire might have originated from an electric short circuit at around 12:15am.

Mohammad Alauddin, general secretary of Mirpur Jhut Samabay Samity Limited and also the owner of the damaged warehouses, claimed property worth about Tk 40 lakh was gutted in the blaze.

He said, on behalf of the Samity he built the makeshift warehouses on a roadside abandoned land nine

A group of extortionists used to collect money from them since they had started the business, he claimed.

Meanwhile, other extortionist groups were also demanding money and threatening to torch the warehouses, he added.

Anisur Rahman, officer-in-charge of Kafrul police station said at 6:00pm they had received no complaint about torching of the warehouses.

TRAIN ACCIDENT BNP says govt probe to be unfair

BNP leaders yesterday alleged that the government probe into the Sirajganj train accident would not be fair due to some speeches made by the govern-

They however said the 'mass inquiry commission' formed by the party would unfold the

mystery of the accident. They were speaking at a press conference at the residence of Sirajganj BNP President and BNP chairperson's adviser Iqbal Hasan Mahmud Tuku at Mohammadpurin the city.

Senior Joint Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir said speeches made by the government proves that its probe will not be fair. That is why BNP has formed the commission to find out the mystery behind the incident, he said.

BNP formed the ninemember 'mass enquiry commission' on Sunday to investigate into the October 11 train accident.

Tuku said police and Rapid Action Battalion are raiding the houses of the leaders and activists of BNP and the activists of Awami League are looting those houses, taking advantage of the absence of male residents.

He alleged that the activists of Awami League are attempting to violate the women of those houses. Tuku claimed that around

18,000 BNP men were sued in eight different cases in connection with the Sirajganj accident and the possible candidates of the union parishad election are being targeted in the cases. Rejecting the claim that BNP did not seek permission

before holding the rally, he said they had to hold the rally at Soidabad due to another programme of prime minister's adviser HT Imam. He said BNP sent letters to

the deputy commissioner, superintendent of police and National Security Intelligence on September 28, informing about the rally. BNP Joint Secretary

General Rizvi Ahmed and Organising Secretary Elias Ali were present at the press conference.

Housewife Murder

House owner picked up

Police yesterday detained house owner and her nephew in connection with the housewife Sumi's murder that occurred at Khilgaon in the city on October 15.

The detainees are house owner Nadira Khandakar and her nephew Dip.

Sumi was murdered at her rented house at Banasree of Khilgaon area.

On the day of incident, police arrested Sumi's husband Mahfuzur Rahman Rana and domestic help Jesmin suspecting their involvement in the murder.


Najimuddin, quoting detained Jesmin, said Dip was involved in an extra-marital relation with Sumi and, fearing leakage of the affair, Dip and other accused had killed Sumi. Sumi was partially mentally challenged, the OC added.

Though at a primary interrogation, Jesmin told the police that a group of three youths, identifying themselves as cable mechanics, entered Sumi's house and killed her.

The OC said the detainees forced Jesmin to give fabricated statements earlier.

Sumi's brother Md Mosharraf filed a murder case with the Khilgaon Police Station following the incident.
