

3,500km new power line for Khulna region

Ecnec okays project

The Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (Ecnec) in its meeting yesterday approved Tk 2,169 crore in seven projects including one for setting up 3,500 kilometres new electric lines in Khulna division.

Ecnec meeting with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in the chair okayed rural Electrification Extension in Khulna Division project worth Tk 393 crore which will end in 2013.

According to the proposal, the lines at greater Khulna will be set up through nine 'Palli Bidyutayan Samitys'. The Power Division said 1.48 lakh new subscribers will get electric connections and it will require additional 36 megawatt of electricity.

Due to power shortage, setting up electricity lines in the rural areas remained suspended for

long. But the government has taken fresh initiative to expand it recently.

Earlier, Ecnec approved power line expansion in other divisions. Khulna was the last in

Fresh attack on Ahmadiyyas

4 houses vandalised in Tangail

Two Ahmadiyyas were seriously injured and four houses vandalised in a fresh attack on the Ahmadiyya Muslim Jamaat community by religious bigots in Ghatail upazila of Tangail on Monday afternoon.

The injured, Shamsul Haque Akanda, 60, and his wife Hasna Banu, 50, of Chandtara village of the upazila were taken to Tangail General Hospital. Hasna was shifted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) a few hours later as her conditions became more critical. "About 12 to 15 extremists led by one Sattar stormed into our

Govt mulls law to restrict tree felling

The government is planning to formulate a law restricting wholesale felling of trees as part of its policy to mitigate climate change, Law Minister Shafique Ahmed has said. "There could be a provision that two trees

have to be planted if one fells one tree," he said, emphasising that the environment must be protected to save mankind. Shafique was addressing the launching of a

report on climate change discourses in Bangladesh at the National Press Club in the capital yesterday as the chief guest.

Dushtha Shasthya Kendra (DSK), a local

NGO, came up with the report. The minister observed that although no

major research has been done to assess the impact of climate change on Bangladesh, the reality is, country's food production, water resources, health and livelihoods are already being affected and will continue to be affected.

This is all because the industrialised countries have emitted too much of carbon, he said, adding, the government is "very much aware" of this, and is working to address the adversities.

A PARK INDEED

Since being designated as a children's park in the early nineties, this strip of land at Naya Bazar in Old Dhaka has been anything but a place for the kids to play. Truckers used it as a parking lot till newspaper reports in 1996 forced Dhaka City Corporation to reclaim it and install slides, seesaws, swings and other playground equipment. But because of the same DCC's neglect, the amusement tools soon rusted and vanished, and the park became a dumping ground for construction rubbish and sewer sludge. The prime minister's recent order to recover the capital's playgrounds highlights how the little ones in this denselypopulated city grow up without much access to outdoor play.

Attack on Chechen parliament kills 6

At least six people were killed and 10 others injured as attackers stormed parliament in the restive Russian republic of Chechnya. At least two security personnel and a civilian worker died -along with at least three attackers, two of whom are thought to have blown themselves up.

Chechen President Ramzan Kadyrov said all the militants were dead.

Correspondents say the incident in the capital Grozny is a reminder that the region is far from stable.

Last year Moscow declared victory against Chechen separatists and there had been a relative lull in the violence under President Kadyrov, the Moscow-backed strongman.

But the whole North Caucasus is seeing an insurgency led by Islamist rebels, correspondents say.

Militants struck at about 0845 (0445 GMT), attacking policemen guarding the parliament building, Mr Kadyrov told Russian news agency Interfax.

"As a result of co-ordinated actions, a special operation lasting 15-20 minutes was carried out to eliminate the militants and free the MPs and technical staff who were inside," he said.




