Goalkeeper Titumir Chowdhury made a couple of brilliant saves earn defending champions Mohammedan Sporting Club a valuable 0-0 draw against a star-studded Muktijoddha Sangsad in the Grameenphone Federation Cup's group Bencounter under floodlights yesterday. In the earlier match, Brothers Union ensured

they got all three points with a come-from-behind 3-1 win against Feni Soccer Club at the Birshreshtha Mostafa Kamal Stadium in Kamalapur, thanks to a brace from Brazilian playmaker Everton.

The match under the floodlight was not only a battle of pride but also a between the4 country's two successful coaches Shafiqul Islam Manik and Maruful Haq. Maruf quit Mohammedan in the middle of the third edition of the professional football league last season and was replaced by Manik, a former coach of Muktijoddha.

On the back of 11 goals in two qualifying matches and boasting a bunch of star players, Muktijoddha were definitely had the upper hand against a depleted Mohammedan side, who even failed to ensure the services of two of their last season's most valuable players -- captain Enamul Haq Sharif and defender Hasan Al Mamun.

A rejuvenated Muktijoddha started the game at a great pace and found the back of the net within 13 minutes, only to find the goal ruled out due to off-side. Twelve minutes later, their Sudanese striker James narrowly missed the target from a set-piece.

But as the game progressed, the scenario changed as youthful Mohammedan succeeded in keeping Muktijoddha at bay. Mohammedan winger Bipul kept on releasing threatening crosses from the left but their strikers failed to capitalise on those.

Nigerian striker Emeka failed to find the net from an unmarked position and later when he headed one home, it was cancelled for off-side.

'Rooney wants out'

Manchester United manager Sir Alex Ferguson confirmed Tuesday star striker Wayne Rooney wants to leave the club, expressing "shock and disappointment' at the player's stance.

"I had a meeting with him. He intimated to me in his own way that he wanted to leave," Ferguson said at a dramatic press conference ahead of United's Champions League tie with Turkish side Bursaspor on Wednesday.

Speculation about Rooney's future had raged for days after Ferguson dropped the 24-year-old England international for last Saturday's Premier League clash with West Bromwich Albion.

It came after Rooney publicly contradicted Ferguson's claims that he was suffering from an ankle injury by telling reporters he was fully fit.

Ferguson finally broke his silence on the saga at an extraordinary press briefing here Tuesday, confirming that Rooney had requested to leave Old Trafford but denying any argument with the player.

A clearly shellshocked Ferguson said he had first been made aware of Rooney's desire to leave before the start of the new season when informed by United chief

"It was a shock. I couldn't believe it," said Ferguson. "In early discussions - in March I think

- we had discussions with him, he intimated he wanted to stay, that he wanted a life contract with the club, that he was at the best club in the world.

"It was terribly disappointing to get the news. We couldn't understand it. We have to keep the door open because he is such a good player," Ferguson said, admitting he was baffled by the position of Rooney, who he signed as a teenager from Everton in 2004.

"We have done nothing but help him since he came to this club, that is why this is such a mystery to us. We've helped him with his private life and other matters," Ferguson said.

"So we're as bemused as anyone can be because we can't understand why he would want to leave a club that is so successful as we are in British football." In another twist, Ferguson revealed

that Rooney had been injured in training on Tuesday and would not be in the squad for Wednesday's game with Bursaspor.

Ferguson also expressed disappointment that Rooney had contradicted his comments about being injured, insisting he had been nursing an ankle knock.

New Zealand captain Daniel Vettori, coach Mark Greatbatch and high performance director, Roger Mortimer, will meet with New Zealand Cricket's board on October 22 to review the disastrous ODI tour of Bangladesh, which ended in a 4-0 thrashing on Sunday.

They are also expected to discuss their upcoming tour of India, for which the squad will be named on October 24, and their World Cup preparation, which is a shambles following an unprecedented defeat in Bangladesh, one of the host nations of the tournament in 2011.

The result plunged New Zealand to seventh in the ICC's ODI rankings, their lowest position since November 2005, but despite acknowledging the gravity of the situation NZC's general manager of cricket, Geoff Allott, said changes to management were unlikely to happen. "It's important that we remain confident in the people we have," he told the Dominion Post. "We've committed to a structure, and we'll be assessed by those decisions."

New Zealand's trip to Bangladesh was marred by poor weather and rain washed out their warm-up games, forcing the visitors to go into the ODI series with no match practice. Their batsmen struggled to adjust to the pace and turn of the pitches in Mirpur and failed to score more than 200 in three out of four innings. "Disappointing is an understatement. When you lose 4-0 in a

country you're going to be playing a World Cup match, then it's a big concern," Allott said. "From a fitness perspective, and a technical perspective, we've got the goods, it's actually the decision-making. Throughout the series there were cross-bat SEE PAGE 18 COL 6
