Trader killed in Rajshahi

A trader was hacked to death in Puthia upazila of Rajshahi on Tuesday night.

The deceased was identified as Saiful Islam, 40, of Bahimali village of Boraigram in Natore district.

Ziaul Alam, officer-incharge of Puthia Police Station, said Saiful, an oil-cake (Khoil-Bhusi) trader, was killed with sharp weapon at Chakzamira village at about

Saiful had a business partner named Zuel in the same village, said the OC adding that Zuel hides after the incident.

Quoting Saiful's younger brother Shafikul Islam, police said Zuel killed Saiful and looted Tk one lakh from Saiful while he was returning home.

Police said the body was recovered from an abandoned land and sent to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital for

A case was filed with Puthia Police Station in this connection.



Govt to be held responsible for unrest: Delwar

The government will be held responsible for anarchy created in the country if it tries to obstruct opposition's peaceful programmes, BNP Secretary General Khandaker Delwar Hossain warned yesterday.

"We will continue our protest in a peaceful manner but if it tries to hinder our programmes then it will be solely responsible for any unrest there from," he said while addressing a demonstration in the city's Muktangon.

The main opposition party yesterday staged demonstrations in all divisional headquarters protesting various issues like the government's notice to BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia to vacate her cantonment house and killing of Boraigram upazila chairman and BNP Leader Sanaullah Noor Babu.

Delwar said the government is scheming to use the judiciary to implement its plans, which will go against the law.
"The government will be solely responsible if any 'special

situation' arises when it interferes with the law," he warned. He said the people will oust the incumbent government through

a peaceful movement as it has failed to run the country properly. "The government is trying to carry out its vengeance by ousting Khaleda from her house," he said.

Delwar said the notice served to Khaleda to vacate her cantonment house was entirely a political decision.

Party leaders Abdul Moyeen Khan, Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, Moazzem Hossain Alal, Habib Un Nabi Khan Sohel and Shafiul Alam Pradhan, among others, spoke on the occasion with Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) Mayor Sadeque Hossain Khoka in the chair. Meanwhile, in a separate statement issued yesterday, Delwar asked the government not to harass BNP's Standing Committee member Salahuddin Quader Chowdhury.

A number of political leaders and cultural activists yesterday demanded a fair investigation into the mysterious fire that killed Ganotantri Party president Nurul Islam and his son Islam Tamohar in 2008.

At a discussion on the Dhaka University campus, the speakers strongly demanded exemplary punishment to the people behind the fire after conducting an acceptable investiga-

They also wanted unprejudiced experts to involve in the investigation, collection and preservation of evidences and detailed forensics to dig out the truth.

Rubi Rahman, wife of Nurul Islam and a lawmaker said, "My husband had fought against the enemies during the 1971 war for independence and the betterment of

the country. But, unfortunately he was killed on this land."

"I lost everything -- husband, son and family. Now, I hope that culprits behind the incident would be tried."

Rubi was speaking at a human chain at TSC intersection where political leaders, cultural activists and activists of Ganotantry Party lightened candles in demand of the quick trial of the culprits.

Nurul Islam, a nominee of Awami League-led grand alliance for Noakhali-1 constituency in the parliamentary election, died the following of a fire breaking out at his Lalmatia residence on December 3, 2008. His son Islam Tamohar was burnt alive.

The investigation of the case, filed following their death, is now under way as a sensational case.

Ganotantri Party General Secretary Nurur Rahman Selim said six investiga-

tion officers of the case have been transferred since the inquiry began. The investigation is apparently stopped now, he claimed.

Awami League lawmaker Fazle Noor Taposh termed the death of Nurul Islam and his son Tomohar a murder. He claimed that it was a move to foil

the ninth parliamentary election held on December 29, 2008.

Former Ducsu VP Mahfuza Khanam said the politics of murder should be stopped anyhow to establish a culture of healthy politics. She demanded fair investigation into all the political murders in the state.

National Human Rights Commission member Aroma Dutta, educationalist Prof Ajoy Roy, lawmaker Noor Afroza Lily and DU teacher Robaet Ferdous were present.

Three killed, 9 injured in road accidents

Three people were killed and around nine others injured in separate road accidents in Chittagong and Jhenidah yesterday.

Our Chittagong correspondent reports: a speeding truck near the 3rd Karnaphuli Bridge ploughed into five three-wheelers (locally known as tempoos) and two rickshaws standing on the sideway early yesterday, killing two men and injuring around nine others.

Ejahar Mia, 53, of West Patiya and Robi, 18, of Chaktai died at Chittagong Medical College Hospital. The injured were under treatment at the hospital.

Police and locals said three accidents have occurred at the same point in the last three weeks for a large roundabout close to the bridge. Vehicles on the road hardly get time to slow down before the roundabout when coming from the slope immediately after the bridge.

At least five people have been killed and some 15 others injured in the accidents near the bridge, they said.

Officer-in-charge Mahbubul Hoque of Bakalia Police Station said they will submit a report to the higher authority soon, regarding changing the size of the roundabout.

Our Jhenidah correspondent adds: an upazila health officer was killed after his motorcycle rammed a three-wheeler carrying bamboos on its roof near Ashannagar on Tuesday night.

Bazlur Rahman, 44, of Shailokupa died at Jhenidah General Hospital.

Officer-in-charge Anwar Hossain of Sailkupa Police Station said Bazlur was returning home at Raninagar on a motorcycle around 9:30pm. As he rammed the three-wheeler in the dark, sharp point of bamboos penetrated into his chest.

A case was lodged with the police station. Police arrested Asaduzzaman, the driver, and Masud, the conductor of the three-wheeler that usually carries passengers.
