Priority should be domestic cricket

It has taken Bangladesh most part of a decade to remove question marks about their ability in the international cricket arena. During this time, they have shown glimpses of brilliance, some of which promised more than the others but ultimately it remained a glimpse.

Through the one-day series win over New Zealand, some of those stinging questions have been answered and that has only happened through hard work. When everyone wondered how a 4-0 whitewash against the Kiwis became possible, the coaches, board officials and the media have pointed out the players' hard work ahead of the series. With every net session during that month-long camp, the chance of doing well against New Zealand increased.

Hardly anybody would want this success to be a one-off or only limited to the one-day format, more accurately people should be looking for ways to sustain this level of success in one-day, five-day and Twenty20 cricket.

So it is high time for Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) to take the 'hard work' route in a bid to restructure domestic cricket once and for all.

Beginning from the standard, pay structure and right down to the culture attached to the game, it is blemished. When the national cricketers miss Premier

League matches or National Cricket League (NCL), the standard goes down a few notches. And it's not just the standard of cricket that is poor but grounds, pitches, dressing-rooms, etc

leave a lot to be desired.

From the regional schools competition to the country's lone first-class tournament, domestic cricket has fewer things to be proud of.

But just a glance at the squad that played against New Zealand would tell you that the flawed system has managed to churn some good talents.

Players like Abdur Razzak, Imrul Kayes, Jahurul Islam, Junaed Siddiqui, Mahmudullah Riyad, Naeem Islam, Rokibul Hasan, Rubel Hossain and Shafiul Islam are direct entrants into the national team due to their domestic runs and wickets. While Riyad, Naeem and Rokibul have played for the Under-19 team, Imrul, Junaed and Shafiul have become part of the Tigers through domestic cricket.

Naeem, part of the plate-winning Under-19 World Cup side of 2004, veered off for a few years until two good seasons in limited overs and first-class cricket did it for him. Junaed spent years in the backwaters of the Dhaka leagues only to be selected for the national team on the back of some good performances.

Despite such an imperfect structure, Imrul, Riyad, and co has made it into the biggest stage.

The recent 4-0 whitewash will work as the perfect catalyst for the board to rethink the domestic game.

First on the agenda should be to make the four-day competition a more important part of Bangladesh cricket' philosophy. The NCL firstclass competition has long been called a picnic SEE PAGE 18 COL 1

Clarke, White lift Aus

Michael Clarke cracked a solid century as Australia recovered from a poor start to post 289-3 in the second one-day international against India on Wednesday.

Australia were struggling at 16-2 after being put in to bat in the day-night match, before skipper Clarke (111 not out) and Mike Hussey (69) bolstered the innings with a 114-run stand for the third wicket. The Australian captain completed his fifth

one-day hundred in the 46th over, hitting paceman Vinay Kumar for two successive fours and then turning the next ball to mid-wicket for a single. Hussey was trapped leg-before by off-

spinner Ravichandran Ashwin in the 37th over after hitting seven fours in his 78-ball knock, but not before setting the stage for a closing-overs onslaught. Australia plundered 84 runs in the last five overs as Cameron White (89 not out) raced to

his half-century with a straight six off seamer Praveen Kumar, the ball hitting a spectator who needed medical assistance. White, who added 129 runs in 13 overs and three balls for the unfinished fourth wicket with

his captain, hammered six sixes and as many fours in a 49-ball blitz, his 11th half-century in one-dayers. Left-arm seamer Ashish Nehra did the early

damage when he dismissed openers Shaun Marsh and Tim Paine in his opening four overs. India had to work hard for their next success as

Clarke and Hussey paced their innings remarkably well, taking no risks and relying more on singles and twos to keep the scoreboard moving.

Clarke cracked one six and seven fours in his 138-ball knock. Fast bowler Mitchell Starc and all-rounder
