Rupganj incident condemned

Several socio-political organisations yesterday condemned the incident of firing by the army men and law enforcers on the villagers who were protesting against forced land purchase for the army housing scheme at Rupganj in Narayanganj.

MIZANUR'S DEATH

Punishment to stalkers demanded

Members of civil society yesterday demanded immediate trial and punishment to the stalkers who allegedly killed Natore College teacher Mizanur Rashid.

They also demanded the government to formulate and implement a law to root out stalking.

The demands came at a human chain programme in front of Aparajeyo Bangla at Dhaka University, jointly organised by Women and Gender Studies Students Forum, Urban Development and Rural Welfare Society and Future Bangladesh Foundation.

DU teachers Prof Tania Haque, Helal Hossain Dhali, Fatema Roushon Jahan, Shafiul Haque from Urban Development and Shaikh Imtiaz from Future Bangladesh were present.

In a press release, Bangladesh National Women Lawyers' Association expressed profound shock at Mizanur's death.

They also demanded the government to arrest the stalkers immediately and ensure exemplary punishment.

Namaz-e-janaza

Our correspondent from Natore adds: The first namaz-e-janaza of Mizanur will be held at Lokmanpur College field and the second at Chak Lakhsmipur under Charghat upazila in Rajshashi district at 8:00am and 10:30am respectively today.

After fighting for life for 12 days, Mizanur died at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University Hospital early yesterday.

On October 12, two local youths attacked Mizanur, a chemistry teacher of Lokmanpur College in Bagatipara upazila, for protesting stalking of college girls. They ran a motorcycle into him, leaving him critically injured.

He was declared clinically dead on October 21. Since then, he had been on a life-support machine.

Officer-in-Charge (OC) Abdus Salam of Bagatipara Police Station said they are conducting raids in different places to arrest Razon, the second accused in the case.

The OC also said a prayer would be made to court today seeking a seven-day remand to quiz Asif, the main accused.

TAX ON PVT VARSITIES HC asks govt to explain, stays NBR notice to NSU

The High Court (HC) yesterday issued a rule upon the government to explain within two weeks why its decision to impose 15 percent tax on the incomes of private universities, medical and dental colleges and engineering universities should not be declared illegal.

An HC bench also stayed for two months a notice issued by the National Board of Revenue (NBR) asking North South University (NSU) to pay 15 percent tax in advance on its annual income.

The bench of Justice Md Ashfaqul Islam and SM Emdadul Hoque came up with the rule and order following a writ petition jointly filed by the NSU, and Golam Jalil, guardian of a student of this university, challenging the government decision.

Secretary to the ministry of finance, and NBR chairman and its deputy commissioner (tax) have been made respondents to the rule and order.

The finance ministry on July 5 this year issued a gazette notification imposing 15 percent tax on annual incomes of all the private universities, medical and dental colleges and engineering universities.

The deputy commissioner (tax) on September 2 this year issued the notice to the NSU authorities to pay 15 percent tax in advance on its annual income for 2011-2012. This notice was also challenged in the writ petition.

Barrister M Shakhawat Hossain appeared for the petitioners.

No need for new law to ban religion-based politics: Law Minister The law minister disagreed with some UNB, Dhaka

Law Minister Barrister Shafique Ahmed yesterday said no new law is needed to ban religion-based politics, after the reprint of the Constitution in the light of the verdict of the Supreme Court on the 5th Amendment.

Talking to reporters after his meeting with European Union Ambassador Stefan Frowein, the law minister said the Election Commission (EC) would scrutinise the constitution or manifesto of any religionbased political party to see if they contradict the reprinted Constitution. The EC may give time to any registered

religion-based party to amend its constitution or manifesto if it is inconsistent with the reprinted Constitution or the EC may cancel its registration, Shafique said.

newspaper reports that the prime minister at a recent cabinet meeting had stated that religion-based party will not be abolished. Rather, Shafique said the prime minister mentioned that the EC will take the deci-

After the reprint of the Constitution, he said the special committee formed by parliament will examine whether any amendment will be needed to add to or subtract any matter from the Constitution.

About his meeting with Frowein, the law minister said the trial of war criminals, among other issues, came up for discussion, saying that Frowein personally supports the trial. However, the ambassador suggested transparency and maintenance of international standard in the trial process.



BSS, Bhairab

President Zillur Rahman yesterday said formation of Bhairab upazila as the 65th district of the country is now under process.

"Cabinet has already given nod to the issue and other formalities of turning Bhairab into a district is now under process," he said while speaking at a civic rally at Haji Asmat Ali College premises here. This is the third visit of Zillur in his election constituency,

Bhairab-Kuliarchar, after assuming office of the president in 2009. The president said he discussed the matter with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina following the long cherished demand of the inhabitants of Bhairab for turning the upazila into a district.

"After hearing my proposal, the prime minister said Bhairab would be transformed into a district," said Zillur. Later, the government asked the cabinet division to look after

The NHRC chairman said the chief justice had already taken steps for quick disposal of cases.


He also urged the chief justice to take steps
