Iftekhar was unveiling the CPI 2010 at a press conference at the National Press Club yesterday afternoon.

In 2009, Bangladesh was among the nine best performers making a significant progress in curbing corruption, bettering its score to 2.4 from 2.1 the previous year.

Transparency International, a Berlin-based global civil society group campaigning against corruption, draws up the index on the basis of 13 surveys by 10 international organisations.

However, not all surveys nclude all countries.

Bangladesh was included in seven surveys for this year's index, which covered the period between January 2009 and September 2010.

"This year's index gives us a

complete perception about the present government. Last year's included only six months of this government and one year of the caretaker government," said TIB trustee board member Prof Muzaffer Ahmad.

TIB Chairman Hafizuddin Khan said, "Political will is the bedrock of any fight against graft. We hear about many commitments at discussions, but see few of those translate nto actions.

Alongside Bangladesh, 73 countries including Honduras, Togo, Azerbaijan, Philippines, Zimbabwe and Nigeria have scored below 3. Bhutan has come up as one

of the nine best performers in curbing corruption this year. The South Asian nation has secured 36th position with a score of 5.7.

Of the other SAARC countries, Sri Lanka and India have done better with a score of 3.2 and 3.3, while Pakistan, Nepal and Maldives scored 2.4, 2.3 and 2.5.

The United States has dropped out of the top 20 least-corrupt nations for the first time since TI began publishing the corruption catalogue 15 years ago. Its ranking has slipped to 22 from 19.

Bangladesh was at the bottom for five years on the trot in 2001-2005. In the folowing three years, it was ranked third, seventh and

Also controversial were the proposals for making the antigraft body accountable to the president; appointing the ACC secretary as principal accountant; and having the commission cease to be a selfgoverned body.

"It's a matter of perception,

and it might differ to some extent from reality. It gives us an idea about the attitude of the political parties and administration with regards to use of power and authority entrusted upon them," said Muzaffer Ahmad.

ACC Chairman Ghulam Rahman said, "The culture of corruption did not develop in one day and we cannot do away with it overnight. The situation can be improved gradually only through united

He also noted that prolonged judicial process does not help things either. "You must punish people

for involvement in corruption. The graft cases must be settled swiftly," he added.

The TIB suggestions for improving the situation include making good on anticorruption electoral pledges, strengthening parliament and ACC, enforcing RTI, introducing culture of wealth disclosure and openness, ensuring integrity in the judiciary and public service, and entrenching the rule of law.

"If the government asks for a suggestion, I would tell them to read their electoral pledges Submitted around six regularly. That's where the solution lies," said Iftekharuzzaman.

and eminent citizens observed that lack of effective steps and political will of the government and less enthusiasm of the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) in fighting graft are responsible for not bringing down corruption to a tolerable level.

The issue of eradicating corruption just remains rhetoric and no action was visible in the last two years, although the government put strong emphasis on curbing corruption in its election manifesto, they observed.

Eminent jurist Shahdeen Malik said there is lot of talks about curbing corruption in the country, but people have hardly seen any action though.

During this government's tenure, a general perception developed that ACC has become less enthusiastic about fighting corruption and no powerful corrupt suspect, be he a politician or bureaucrat, has been charged with corruption, he mentioned in his reaction. Prosecution of normal

criminal cases or non-

corruption related crimes have become increasingly biased, he said, adding, "If the situation goes on, I would not be surprised to see the country's score sliding down."

Malik suggested stopping of partisanship in criminal cases and equipping ACC with at least six fulltime lawyers for prosecuting corruption cases. Academician Prof Dilara

Chowdhury commented that the ruling parties usually lack political will to wipe out corruption. "They [ruling parties] just keep the issue in rhetoric," she
