Biman travellers left in the lurch

Five flights delayed, over 46 pilots claimed to be sick; striking pilots given 48 hours to join work or face consequences

The Biman pilots' strike has left hundreds of passengers home and abroad in the lurch as flight delays have been ranging between 10 and 27 hours.

There is still no light at the end of the tunnel as the pilots and the management of Biman Bangladesh Airlines stand their ground. The management even decided to go tough on pilots and gave a 48-hour ultimatum to its pilots to rejoin work.

Five flights were delayed between 10 and 27 hours yesterday after over 46 pilots of the national flag carrier have claimed to be sick since Tuesday. They are protesting against the withdrawal of four Biman cockpit crew from flight duty.

Hajj flights, however, remained out of the purview of the strike.

More than 500 passengers, including Bangladeshi migrant workers, had to face the delays in Dhaka yesterday. Some migrant workers even resorted to demonstrations at Shahjalal International Airport fearing they would lose their overseas jobs due to the delays.

"I am scared, I may lose my job if I fail to reach Kuwait in time," said a migrant worker declining to publish his name.

Biman passengers who were supposed to be on their way to Kuala Lumpur and Muscat yesterday would have to wait till 10:00pm today for the Kuala Lumpur flight and 1:00pm for the Muscat flight.

Biman passengers heading to London and Kolkata also had to wait at the airport for hours yesterday.

The stand off between the pilots and Biman management has been continuing

for the last six days with the passengers having to bear the brunt.

The pilots and the management are in a feud over benefits for pilots aged between 57 and 62 years. The pilots say Biman extended their working age but took away a lot of benefits.

The matter is pending with a court. Biman said it is not interested in going for a settlement with its crew.

On the other hand, cockpit crew said they would continue the strike and would not sit at the negotiation table unless the management cancels its recent dutysuspension orders against four pilots and show-cause notices issued to some others.

With the government staying quiet about the issue, Biman board of directors sat for an emergency meeting yesterday SEE PAGE 15 COL 7

Around 1,400 bighas of land was already purchased for the project in Rupganj before Saturday's violence.

In the wake of the clashes, army officials have temporarily stopped purchasing land there. Their original target was to buy around

12,000 bighas. The Rupganj incident sent the army authorities trying to figure out what went wrong. After much deliberation, they identified mismanagement as one of the reasons for the mess-up. They also concluded they should have tried the

civilian way to buy civilian lands. The high-ups also reviewed the ambitious housing project, and are now weighing up new strategies to implement it.

"The project might be split into several parts. Besides Rupganj, some other sites on the outskirts of the capital might be included in it. A decision in this regard is likely to come soon," said an officer.

BUILDING ON JHEEL

Close shave for tenants

Mizanur Rahman has just finished constructing his three-storey building in a jheel (a long pool of water) at Norda in the capital's Dakkhinkhan area. He had also rented it out to tenants who were supposed to move in from Monday next.

The building toppled on a tin-shed house at the edge of the jheel Tuesday night. However, no one has been reported injured or missing.

The residents of the tin-shed house, Jyotsna Begum and her two daughters, were miraculously saved as they were all in a room, which did not crumble under the collapsed building.

The mother and daughters moved to a new house, as their former one was severely damaged and no longer suitable for living.

During a spot visit, it was seen that the building lacked proper foundation and the site is three feet under water. Mizanur had erected the structure on 18 six-feet-long pillars each of which stood on a four square feet of concrete plates.

Locals said they warned Mizanur not to construct a building on such pillars.

Some more one-storey houses have been built there filling up a portion of the jheel while many other plots are there demarcated with concrete poles.

When contacted over the phone and asked about the Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha permission for the structure, Mizanur switched off his cellphone.

Fire fighters, police and people from Dhaka Electric Supply Authority rushed to the spot around 9:00 that night. They, however, did not move the rubble, as there were no casualty or miss-

ing people. Power supply in the area had to be cut off for the night since the building collapsed snapping electric cables.

On June 1 this year, 25 people were killed and many others injured as a five-storey tin-made structure collapsed on nearby tin-shed houses in the capital's Begunbari area.

Press Council Verdict

Test recommended for aspiring journos

Bangladesh Press Council has recommended arranging an entrance examination for those willing to take up journalism as a profession. The council made the observation in the

verdict of a case against a weekly newspaper, said a handout of the Press Information Department yesterday.

It is time to prevent anyone from taking up journalism as a profession without obtaining a certificate similar to that issued by the Bar Council or Medical and Dental councils, the

Press Council observed.

The code of conduct set by the Press Council for journalists is not enough, it said.

Md Motiur Rahman, joint commissioner of the Customs Department, filed a case against Sheersha Kagoj, a Dhaka-based weekly, for publishing a series of reports labelling him as "corrupt".

He also alleged that the newspaper did not publish his rejoinders correctly.

The newspaper however claimed before the Press Council that the news reports were based on facts.
