Cops guilty, but no custodial deaths

Claims govt probe report for HC on 2 deaths in city

A home ministry probe report claims two persons who died mysteriously on July 1 in the capital were not killed in custody but holds police responsible for one's death.

The investigation blames an assistant subinspector and a constable of Darussalam Police Station for the death of Mujibur Hossain and recommends punitive action against them.

Directed by the High Court on July 5, the ministry investigated the alleged custodial deaths of Mujibur of Darussalam and Mizanur Rahman of Gulshan.

Earlier, two rights bodies filed a public interest litigation with the HC with an aim to stop custodial deaths.

Mujibur allegedly died in custody of Darussalam police and Mizanur died in an alleged shootout with Gulshan police.

"The death of Mujibur, who drowned in the Turag river, cannot be considered a death in custody. But Assistant Sub-inspector of Darussalam Police Station Md Abu Sayem and constable Ziaur Rahman Bhuiyan can be charged with his drowning," the report says.

It adds they (Sayem and Ziaur) can be charged with serious neglect of duty and concealment of the facts about Mujibur from the higher authorities.

The Office of the Attorney General received the probe report on October 29 and would soon submit it to the HC for a decision in this regard, insiders say.

The report says Mizanur was hit by bullets during a chase by police when he was fleeing on a hijacked car. Mizanur and his associate Manik were injured in the shootout with law enforcers, it adds.

Lottery for admission

24 schools in city to enrol children thru' lottery, instead of admission test

The government has taken an initiative for introducing lottery system for admission into class I at the 24 state-owned high schools in the capital next year.

It believes this would end the psychological torment a preschooler has to go through to get a spot in those schools.

Viqarunnisa Noon School, one of the reputed and most sought-after schools in the country, decided to go for lottery to admit class I students in 2011. The system is already being used by Holy Cross School and College, Mohammadpur Preparatory High School, Herman Mainer College, YWCA School and College.

Every year children aged between five and six years wade into battle for admission in reputed schools. They undergo enormous pressure of memorising information difficult to remember at the tender age. They have to prepare for weeks before they finally appear for the test at their parents' desired schools.

Apart from guidance at home, many parents send their children to coaching centres, which take a handsome amount of

Tortured domestic help rescued

Rab members yesterday rescued a minor domestic help, tortured severely by her employers, from a house on Dilu Road in the capital's Ramna area.

The law enforcers arrested her employers Moshiur Rahman Titu, a trader, and his wife. They were handed over to Ramna police.

The victim, ten-year-old Sohagi Akhter, daughter of Aynal Hossain of Gopalganj, was admitted to One Stop Crisis Centre (OCC) at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH).

Dr Bilkis Begum, coordinator of OCC at the DMCH, said there were injury marks all over Sohagi's body.


The victim told the law enforcers that Titu's wife Lima Begum often beat her severely with iron rod for making small mistakes. Lima poured boiling water on her on Saturday.

Assistant Superintendent of Police Kudrat-e-Khuda of Rab-3 said Titu's neighbours informed them over the phone that a domestic help had been tortured severely at his house.
