#### War crimes tribunal amends rules of procedure

The International Crimes Tribunal has amended its rules of procedure to stipulate that anyone being investigated for crimes against humanity in 1971 will be considered an

Previously, a person would be regarded as an accused only if formal charges against him were submitted to the tribunal.

As per the amended rules, the tribunal can now issue orders to arrest the seven people who are being investigated for war crimes but have vet to be detained.
