

'Kalim Sharafi's death irreparable loss'

President Zillur Rahman and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and different socio-cultural and political organisations yesterday expressed deep shock at the death of renowned Rabindra Sangeet exponent and legendary artist Kalim Sharafi.

Kalim Sharafi who had been suffering from old age complications died yesterday.

The president said Kalim Sharafi was a luminous star of the music arena. "His contribution to practice and flourishing of music would be ever remembered," he added.

In another message, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said the death of Kalim Sharafi, also a freedom fighter, is an irreparable loss to the music and cultural arenas of the Bangalee nation.

Sheikh Hasina prayed for eternal peace of the departed soul and conveyed sympathy to the bereaved family.

Our correspondent adds: Speaker Abdul Hamid said Kalim throughout his life worked for flourishing Bangla culture and his departure will create a vacuum in the country's cultural sector.

Dhaka University Vice Chancellor AAMS Arefin Siddique said Kalim Sharafi played a significant contribution in flourishing the country's cultural and different democratic movements.

Communist Party of Bangladesh President Rashed Khan Menon and General Secretary Anisur Rahman Malik termed Kalim "a frontline soldier" of different non-communal democratic movement.

The nation will severely feel his vacancy in this time, when the social, political and cultural movements are being strengthened day by day in demand of the trial of war criminals, they added.

DCC polls chapter 'closed' now Says EC commissioner

UNB, Dhaka

The Election Commission (EC) continues to backtrack on holding the Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) elections.

"I do not want to make any comment about the DCC elections. This chapter is closed now. The government may have a political plan about the DCC elections," Election Commissioner M Shakwat Hossain told journalists at his office yesterday.

Referring to the recent comment of IGRD Minister Syed Ashrafur Islam on union parishad, municipal and DCC elections, Shakwat said the EC is always ready to arrange all local government elections, as well as the DCC elections.

He said as per the election rules, the local government elections are being held within 180 days of the conclusion of their five-year term.

"But, the five-year period has already expired, after negotiating with the local government ministry the EC has to move towards holding these elections," he said.

Shakwat said it will be very difficult to arrange these elections after next March-April due to ghastly weather.

Replying to a question, he said the EC will hold dialogues with the political parties within this year.

"We have been working to arrange dialogues with the political parties. A little work remains to arrange the dialogues," he said.

2 factories fined for pollution

The Department of Environment (DoE) yesterday fined two factories Tk 17.31 lakh for polluting environment in Syllur of the city.

A team of DoE led by Director (Enforcement) Munir Chowdhury fined Torab Uddin Steel Mills Ltd in Shyampur Tk 8.5 lakh for releasing toxic fumes containing carbon dioxide and carbon monoxide. These fumes are causing serious health hazards for the locals, said DoE sources.

The team asked the factory owner to install fume extraction unit for regulating the release of toxic fumes by November 30.

In a separate drive, the team fined Tajmahal Dyeing Tk 9.31 lakh for discharging untreated liquid waste into the Buriganga River.

It also shut down the factory operations until its owners set up an effluent treatment plant (ETP).

The dyeing mill has so far released almost 2,00,000 cubic metres of waste into the river since 1990, said DoE sources.

'Punish stalkers, fight them off'

Human rights and NGO workers demanded exemplary punishment of all stalkers, especially the killers of Chanpa Rani Bhownik and Mizanur Rashid.

Eight NGOs and human rights organisations yesterday demanded exemplary punishment to the stalkers involved in the recent incidents of stalking in a press conference at Dhaka Reporters' Unity.

Leaders of eight NGOs and human rights organisations yesterday demanded exemplary punishment to the stalkers involved in the recent incidents of stalking in a press conference at Dhaka Reporters' Unity.

Expressing their deep concern over the alarming rise of stalking incidents in the country, they also placed a seven-point demand emphasizing on necessary amendments in the existing laws to protect women from stalking.

Ten men and two women got killed by stalkers while 77 men and 166 women were assaulted since January this year, they said in a written statement.

Moreover, 26 women committed suicide

besides a father of a woman victim in this period, they claimed on newspaper reports.

Earlier, the organisations - Ain-o-Salish Kendra (ASK), Brac, Blast, Karmajibi Nari, Mahila Parishad, Nijera Bari, Nagorik Udyog and Steps - sent a 12-member team to Chanpa Rani's residence in Faridpur and a 10-member team to Mizanur Rahman's house in Natore on November 1 to investigate into the incidents.

After investigating Faridpur and Natore incidents, they alleged that some quarters are trying to divert the killing incidents to accidents there.

They also demanded security for the victims' families referring to the stalkers' previous criminal records.

Hamida Hossain, chairperson of ASK, expected a more concerted effort especially from the lawmakers and lawyers communities to stop the dangerous trend.

She, however, observed a strong consensus in the mass as well as in the administration against stalkers during the investigation tour.

ASK Director Nina Goshwami read out the statement that also demanded state allocation

for education expenses for Chanpa Rani's three daughters, awareness programmes in educational institutions, correction of young stalkers through institutional initiatives.

Khushi Kabir of Nijera Bari, Rokeya Rafique of Karmajibi Nari, Maksudia Laili of Mahila Parishad, Muhsin Ali of Blast, Shipa Hafiza of Brac, Ranjan Karmakar of Brac, Shiba Hafiza of Brac, were also present in the conference.

Speakers at a human chain on Dhaka University campus yesterday demanded exemplary punishment to the stalkers and killers in the country.

For security of girls and women, they also urged the government to set an example by ensuring punishment of the killers.

Demanding the government's stern actions to uproot stalking, Faridpur Muslim Mission Students Association of Dhaka formed a human chain at Aparajeyo Bangla.

Proctor Prof AKM Saiful Islam Khan, Director of Darul Ehsan College Prof Farid Uddin Khan, Principal of Muslim Mission College collage Abdullah Al Mamun and hundreds of students attended the peace protest. The DU proctor urged people for a united

protest to eliminate the social malady.

Different organisations yesterday demanded impartial investigation into the suicide of teenage girl Rupali Rani and exemplary punishment to the stalker Sushil Shim, who kidnapped her and kept her confined in a room of his residence in Sirajganj.

In a statement, Bangladesh Mohila Parishad President Ayesha Khanam and Maleka Banu demanded necessary measures to ensure security for the victim's family members.

They also demanded formulation of separate law to stop staking and called upon all to launch social movement against stalking.

Another statement of Samajtantrik Mohila Forum said the organisation staged a demonstration rally demanding punishment of the stalkers who were responsible for taking lives of numerous girls.

Meanwhile, leaders of Samajtantrik Chhatra Front demonstrated yesterday on Dhaka University campus with the same demands and announced to hold protest programme in the all the education institutions, thanas, and districts across the country.
