REGISTRATION WITH RAJUK

## Realtors respond poorly

Less than 50 percent of around 800 real estate developers have applied for mandatory registration with Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha in the last four months despite repeated extension of the time limit for this.

The first deadline for registration was July 31, the second was September 30 and the third is November 30.

Rajuk officials said around 350 realtors have so far sought registration. Poor response of developers to get registered accounts for extension of the deadline time and again.

Asked about this, Rajuk Chairman Md Nurul Huda said this time they will strictly enforce the deadline. "We will take action as per the law concerned against all those builders who will not apply for registration with Rajuk within the time limit."

When the process of registration is over, Rajuk will blacklist developers who will breach contract with their buyers of flats or with landowners, cancel their registration and then go for punitive action as per the law concerned, he said.

Huda also said developers not registered with Rajuk will not get approval of plans for construction of buildings within its jurisdiction.

"We have taken these decisions to streamline the activities of the builders and make them work in a transparent way, and to reduce sufferings of people of the city," he said.

Contacted, former president of Real Estate and Housing Association of Bangladesh Tanvirul Haque Probal said Rehab has about 800 members, of whom around 40 are land developers.

# Suicide blast in Pak mosque kills 50

A suicide bomber struck a mosque in northwest Pakistan during prayers yesterday, causing the roof to collapse and killing at least 50 people. The bombing may have targeted an anti-Taliban activist, officials said.

The blast was the latest in a series of attacks at mosques and Sufi shrines in Pakistan, and underscored the relentless security challenge to a nation where Islamist militants have thrived despite US-supported army offensives against them.

The explosion occurred in Darra Adam Khel, an area near Pakistan's tribal regions where Taliban-led militants have been active. Hundreds of worshippers had gathered at the Sunni mosque Friday afternoon for the most popular prayer session of the week.

The mosque's roof caved in, trapping people in debris. People in private vehicles rushed the wounded to hospitals in Peshawar, the main city in the northwest, TV footage showed. A woman was beating her head, while two elderly men in blood-soaked clothes lay in a

Uncertainty still hangs over BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia's countrywide campaign, as the party fell short to finalise the programme scheduled for this month.



## Turkish PM due on Nov 13

Trade, connectivity to dominate talks

Talks between Bangladesh and Turkey will revolve around air connectivity and increase in bilateral trade and investment during the two-day official visit of Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdoðan to Dhaka on November 13-14.

This will be the country's second high level visit since Turkish President Abdullah Gül's visit last February.

Official sources said Dhaka is looking forward to the visit, as there are prospects of investment from Turkey looming over the horizon and both the countries are eager to enhance their ties of cooperation.

In the connectivity arena, Turkish Airlines would launch its Istanbul-Karachi-Dhaka flight in December and plans to start a direct flight between Istanbul and Dhaka in the near future, SEE PAGE 15 COL 2

#### Govt warned not to ban religion-based politics
