So far, 78,675 hajj pilgrims have already reached Jeddah safely and the rest 12,062 are scheduled to leave the country by November 10.

"However, Saudi Arabian Airlines is ready to operate their Hajj flights for additional two days till November 12, if required," the minister added.

Of the hajj pilgrims who have already reached Jeddah, Biman carried 40,993, Saudi Airlines 12,245 while the third carriers ferried 25,437. Biman still have the capacity of carrying 4,216 hajj pilgrims.




