





Photography exhibition at Drik Gallery

"Representing Bangladesh" is the title of an exhibition featuring two photographers MM Zahidur Rahman Biplob and Mohammed Golam Sarower. The exhibition is currently on at Drik Gallery in Dhanmondi, Dhaka.

Pathshala teacher Rafiqul Islam selected the best 40 images (each photographer contributed 20) for the exhibition. State Minister for Housing and Public Works Advocate Abdul Mannan Khan inaugurated the exhibition as the chief guest. Among others, accomplished photographers Golam Mustafa, Rafiqul Islam, Quazi Hamidul Haque and Chanchal Mahmud spoke at the inauguration.

"A photograph may tell many stories but, with the changing aspects of globalisation, many a photograph can tell a single focused story that we call documentary photography," said Golam Mustafa.

"Bangladesh is an open studio for me. Earlier, I photographed to make a living, to tease my brain, and now I'm doing it to nourish my soul. I head to Bangladesh from New York, whenever I get the urge to explore my 'beloved studio'," said Quazi Hamidul Haque.

"Photography is still a neglected art form in Bangladesh. It has received no public and private patronage so far," Chanchal Mahmud remarked.

Art is visually pleasing. If rays of beauty endlessly attract the aesthetic eye behind the lens, the art of pho-

tography is produced. The artiste duo roamed around from the Sundarbans to Bandarban, from Tanguar Haor to Nijhum Dwip, from Shomeswari river to St. Martin's Island, from Narail to Bagerhaat and other parts of Bangladesh in search of exquisite images. Impassable hills, unfathomable sea, pointed roots of mangrove forest did not appear as impediments to them. Four seasons -- monsoon, autumn, late autumn and winter -- of Bangladesh have been conspicuously highlighted through the images.

scape and sunset are common images framed by both photographers. From a confused squirrel to a successful kingfisher, from a boasting butterfly to a twitchy dragonfly -nothing has been left out from their artistic definition of nature. According to post structuralism, language is incapable of expressing universal meaning, as it is slippery; it rather conveys local, traditionally imposed meaning. Photography or any other visual art form has also a language of its own and claims to have universal mean-Nature and its elements, land- ing. When the language of images

speaks, written words or lingual titles prove to be futile. Through attaching titles to their artworks, the participating photographers Biplob and Sarwar have seemingly done injustice to the larger-than-life images as they can speak for themselves.

In his image "Bangladesh", the way Biplob has moved the wheel of childhood through the game of light and shadow on a tender morning is remarkable. As white rays dance with the azure and golden of the sky, it not only grips an art connoisseur but also anyone taking a peek.

Biplob's "Harmony" is a depiction



His other works feature a cautious deer from the Sundarbans, a lonely moon among clouds, an intriguing chameleon, blissful birds at leisure, a dedicated spider weaving its web, a devotional octogenarian woman, voyage of a bamboo fleet on a narrow creek and more. "Simplicity," "Silence," "Confident" and "Imbalance" are several portraits by Biplob.

Sarower's "Panoramic view of Bandarban" passionately speaks of the intermingling of lush green hilly forest with an autumn sky. Other images by him focus on the serene waves at St. Martin, dew drops trapped in spider webs, flowers from Narail, Nilgiri Resort in Bandarban, snails climbing a tree at the Sundarbans, coastal greenery and more.

Biplob has bagged several national awards in photography. Sarower has a professional degree from ICMAB. He won two international awards, including 1st prize at SAARC Charter Day 2006 organised by SAARC Agricultural Information Centre (SAIC).

The exhibition is open from 3 to 8 pm everyday and will continue till November 11.

Dipabali celebration lights up the night

The traditional Hindu festivals of Dipabali and Kali Puja were celebrated with festivity in Thakurgaon on Friday evening.

The devotees offered flowers and food, special prayers and lit candles for the eternal peace of the departed souls. Houses were decorated with lights and greetings were exchanged as well.

Apart from the celebrations, a vibrant cultural programme was held at the Kali Mandir premises that captivated Hindu devotees as well as other people who went there. The cultural programme featured Shyama Sangeet, devo-

tional and Baul songs rendered by Mithun Debnath, Shampa Shaha, Rumi, Shanjoy Gosh Sharan Das and others. Cultural personality of the district Dev Kumer Guha Thakurata conducted the cultural programme. Earlier a musical

sketch was staged at the same venue. Deputy Commissioner of Thakurgaon Muhammad Shahiduzzaman visited the temple in the evening and

exchanged greetings with the leaders of the Hindu community.



SUSHANTA GHOSH, Barisal

Hindu community members of Barisal on Thursday night observed Maha Shamshan Dipali at Maha Shamshanghat, Dipabali and Diwali Utsab at houses.

This religious festival of the Barisal Hindu community has a

traditional history of 160 years and is observed with special religious rituals at Barisal Maha Shamshan since 1850 on the night before Kali puja. Narayan Chandra Dey, secretary of Barisal Maha Shamshan

Rakkha Committee, said the festival has been observed only at Adi-Shamshan Ghat of Natun Bazaar and Maha Shamshan Ghat of Kawnia, two crematoriums in Barisal city colourfully since 1850.

Several thousands from different parts of the country and also from across the border attend the festival every year. Organisers released several 'Fanush', (huge colourful bal-

loons) in the sky on the night of Diwali. The devotees offered flowers and foods, offered special

prayers and lit candles and decorated houses on the occasion. Shayama Sangeet was also arranged at several mandap in the city.

A two-day Mukunda Mela (fair) where traditional household and food items were sold, along with a cultural function and 'aroti' competitions started at the premises of the Kali Mandir of Charon Kobi Mukunda Das at Kashipur area of the city, said Manik Mukherjee Kudu, president of the Mandir Committee.


