CONDITIONS FOR PARTY REGISTRATION

Jamaat noncompliant, no EC action yet

Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami's registration with the Election Commission still remains despite the party's failure to meet the conditions for retaining registration even nine months after the expiry of the one-year deadline.

The party managed to retain its registration as the commission's moves were confined to urging Jamaat to amend some provisions in its charter that do not conform to the country's constitution and the Representation of the People Order (RPO), said some officials at the

The commission did not compel the party to meet the conditions stipulated in the RPO for retaining registration, they said.

According to the RPO, Jamaat was supposed to correct its charter and submit it to the EC by

the deadline of January 24 this year.

A source at the commission said the EC on November 2 decided to ask Jamaat once again to amend its charter and submit it to the commission within a specific timeframe to maintain registration.

"We will send a letter to Jamaat-e-Islami asking them to bring necessary changes to its charter to conform with the registration criteria. We will decide our next course of action on receipt of its response," Election Commissioner Muhammed Sohul Hussein said on Thursday.

An EC official said the matter has dragged on for long as the commission did not pursue the matter properly.

Sandwip likely to be mainland's part

Rubber dams to create new land in Bay

The Sandwip and Urir Char islands are likely to become part of mainland Noakhali in the near future thanks to the Meghna estuary development project.

Sandwip is currently facing severe erosion problems.

Several dams would be built at different strategic points in the estuary and they would help create more char lands by artificially concentrating deposits in that area, experts said yesterday at a workshop.

Bangladesh gained 598 square kilometres of

new land in 35 years from 2008 in the Meghna estuary near Noakhali, said the experts of Bangladesh Water Development Board at the workshop. They said over the years Bangladesh lost 1,045 square km of land due to erosion and gained 1,642 square km of new land at the Meghna estuary. On an average year, Bangladesh gains 17.1 square km of land, they said at a technical session.

Around 10,000 hectares of new land could be reclaimed within the next couple of years, the experts said.

Myanmar votes in rare election

Fears of fraud amid tight security

Myanmar held its first election in 20 years yesterday under tight security, a scripted vote that assures army-backed parties an easy win but brings a hint of parliamentary politics to one of Asia's most oppressed states.

State TV did not mention the election until a news bulletin four hours after polls had closed that showed army ruler Than Shwe casting his vote. Results may not be known for a day or more. Witnesses reported low turnout and irregularities. Two military-backed parties running virtually unopposed

were certain to prevail in a carefully choreographed end to half a century of direct army rule. Complex election rules stifled any prospect of a pro-democracy upset.

Imaduddin added Conoco representatives have agreed with the government position on the PSC and expressed their intention to sign it as early as possible.

Tangail district administration yesterday introduced karate training for girl students so that they can deal with stalkers. In the first such govern-


ment move, the district administration opened a training camp for the students of Sheikh Fazilatunnesa Mujib Women's College in the town. Deputy Commissioner of
