Foul play behind delay

Uncertainty grips Ghorashal power project as communications minister meddles with tender process

A tender process for a 300 megawatt power plant project in Ghorashal, crucial to mitigating the country's power supply crisis, is set to be cancelled in the face of a tussle between the communications minister and the Power Development

Communications Minister Syed Abul Hossain alleged that the company selected as the lowest bidder had fabricated its documents, a view that PDB did not subscribe to.

Incidentally, Abul Hossain's family

owned company Sahco is representing a Chinese company that could not become the lowest bidder in the same tender. The difference of opinions between

Until Abul Hossain became a minister in 2009, he was the chief of Sahco. After his exit, the company's seven-member board of directors is headed by Nurul Haque. Three of the directors however are the minister's wife and two daughters.

Between September and October this year, PDB sought the Cabinet Purchase Committee's approval thrice to award the contract to Chinese Sinohydro Corporation. But every time the communications minister, who is a member of the committee, opposed PDB's choice, and the committee refrained from approving the contract.

All that the PDB chief could say in response was, the Chinese embassy had validated all Sinohydro documents.

Amid this row, Finance Minister AMA Muhith stopped the communications minister, saying the decision on this project will be taken later through a discussion among the purchase committee members.

Instead of a discussion, the finance minister on November 2 sent a written note to the committee members, saying since it was hard for them to agree on the matter, the tender may be scrapped.

He noted that floating a fresh tender will take additional three months, but it will resolve the disagreements, sources

MP joins drive to free Kalyanpur canal

A joint team of Dhaka Wasa and district administration yesterday resumed their eviction drive to recover Kalyanpur Ka Khal (canal) from encroachers.

Local lawmaker Aslamul Haq, who opposed a scheduled eviction drive of the authority in the area on October 31, assisted the team in conducting the drive and spent over one hour with them.

"I inaugurated the drive on November 3 and now we all including me, local people, Wasa and district administration will complete the

drive," said the lawmaker.
