### BDR MUTINY AT BANDARBAN 35 jawans convicted

The Special Court-16 of Bangladesh Rifles yesterday sentenced 35 jawans of Bolipara camp of 10 Rifle Battalion in Bandarban to different terms in prison for their involvement in the mutiny on February 25-26 last year. In addition to jail terms, the court also fined each convict Tk 100.

The convicts are to serve prison terms ranging from a minimum of six months to a maximum of seven years.

Four BDR men were sentenced to seven years' term, while two to six years', eight to five years', one to four and half a years', four to four years', six to three years', four to two years', one to a year's and the remaining five to six months of imprisonment.

#### Army-backed party sweeps 'rigged' polls
