Subs lead Sevilla

Substitutes Alvaro Negredo and Alejandro Alfaro scored second-half goals to lead Sevilla to a 2-0 win over 10man Valencia on Monday.

Valencia were a man down from the 25th minute when midfielder Mehmet Topal was shown a red card for a tackle on Martin

Caceres.

Unai Emery's team put up strong resistance until Negredo came on in the 53rd. One minute later, the striker jumped on the rebound from Careces' shot to score the opener.

Alfaro sealed the victory by heading in Mouhamadou Dabo's cross from the right in the 77th.

"We had the ball, but we couldn't find the space to attack with precision, but luckily the play of the goal arrived and I could score," Negredo told the Spanish television channel La Sexta. "Then Alfaro put the game away."

Sevilla is now level with fifth-place Valencia on 17 points, but is behind on goal difference.

Real Madrid stayed top with 26 points after continuing its 11-year unbeaten streak against cross-town rival Atletico Madrid with a 2-0 win on Sunday. Barcelona held on to second with 25 points after handing Getafe a 3-1 defeat, while Villarreal kept pace in third with 23 points with its 4-1 victory over Athletic Bilbao.

Sevilla has yet to lose at the Sanchez Pizjuan stadium this season, while Valencia is now

winless in its last four outings.

Sevilla controlled possession early on and took advantage of Diego Perotti's speed on the right flank. The Argentine winger soon found Luis Fabiano, who tested goalkeeper Cesar Sanchez with a point-blank strike from close range in the 11th.

Even before Topal's sending off, Valencia only managed a shot by Juanma Mata that goalkeeper Javier Varas had to stretch his leg to

Gregorio Manzano's squad tried to press its extra-man advantage, but Cesar was well positioned to easily control a header by Luis Fabiano in the 29th and shots by Perotti and Koffi Romaric in injury time before the break.

Vicente Guaita replaced an injured Cesar in goal at halftime and soon had to deal with a long strike by Sevilla's Fernando Navarro.

Manzano's decision to add a third striker paid off immediately when Negredo slotted the ball between Guaita's legs.

Valencia coach Unai Emery said the decision to send-off Topal was "incorrect" and

"conditioned the outcome of the game." Sevilla pushed forward after the goal and Luis Fabiano hit the crossbar from a pass by Caceres in the 60th.

Valencia looked for the equalizer, and Aritz Aduriz forced Varas to go to the ground to stop

his strike from the edge of the area in the 67th. After Sevilla's second goal, the opposing

'keepers kept out clear opportunities by Valencia's Roberto Soldado and Negredo with the game wide open, and Sevilla's Diego Capel hit the post in injury time.

Gian Piero Gasperini was sacked as coach of Serie A side Genoa on Monday after four years at the helm, the president of the club Enrico Preziosi announced.

Gasperini - whose side slipped to 14th in the table after their second successive defeat by Palermo on Sunday - has been replaced by Davide Ballardini, who was sacked by Lazio in February.

Gasperini is the second Serie A coach to lose his job -Bologna sacked Franco Colomba just before the season started.

Pippo hints at exit

AC Milan veteran Filippo Inzaghi has hinted he may seek a January exit after falling down the pecking order.

Inzaghi, 37, is no longer guaranteed regular football at the San Siro, with Zlatan Ibrahimovic established as first-choice following his arrival from Barcelona. Inzaghi showed he is still

capable of making an impact when he hit a brace against Real Madrid in the Champions League last week, but he played no part in the 3-2 win over Bari that followed. "I still want to be impor-

tant," Inzaghi told Rete 4. "I have received two offers and I am happy that someone is still looking at me.

"I don't want to be employed only in moments of despair, but let's see in two months. I have an incredible affection for Milan but I still really want to play and I feel good."

However, Inzaghi signed a new deal in May to tie him to the club until 2011 and Milan vice-president Adriano Galliani says the player will not be allowed to move on.

Sir Alex Ferguson insisted on Tuesday that Manchester City's huge transfer spending does not make silverware an inevitability.

Ferguson takes his United side across town to Eastlands on Wednesday night for one of the mostanticipated derbies in decades.

The rivalry between the two clubs has reached new levels since the Abu Dhabi United Group took over at City in September 2008.

Since then, under Mark Hughes and Roberto Mancini, City have spent significantly in almost every transfer window to overhaul their squad at huge cost. Their most controversial signing was

taking Carlos Tevez from United in the summer of 2009 and there were also linked with a move for Wayne Rooney during the England forward's contract dispute.

But City were defeated in both Premier League derbies last season as well as losing out in the League Cup semifinals.

Mancini spent in the region of 130 million pounds to sign half a dozen players

tain amount of money from television and they spend it immediately in trying to improve their teams.

Although the injection of money at City has escalated the rivalry between the clubs, Ferguson is adamant the game will never be like the match against traditional rivals Liverpool. He said: "It's a different type of derby to

the Liverpool game. "The Liverpool game is one of honours in terms of trophies won. Liverpool edge it in

Cups and World Championships that type of thing and that is undoubtedly the two most successful clubs in British football. "When we meet it's a different type of derby game. Now the game between our-
