# Dour Mancunian derby

A Michael Essien goal after half an hour saw Chelsea bounce back from Sunday's defeat to Liverpool to open a four-point lead after Manchester United were held 0-0 by Manchester City in a dour stalemate.

Meanwhile a disappointing Manchester derby saw City and United cancel each other out in a cagey encounter at Eastlands where goalscoring opportunities were thin on the ground.

Arsenal recovered from the shock of their home defeat to Newcastle on Sunday by easing past struggling Wolves 2-0 at Molineux.

The Gunners took the lead with one of the fastest goals of the season, Marouane Chamakh netting his seventh goal of the campaign in less than a minute to set the

Gunners on the way to victory.

Chamakh added a second in injury time to leave Arsenal in third place, five points adrift of leaders Chelsea, and one behind Manchester United in

However the hero for the Gunners was maligned keeper Lukasz Fabianski, who pulled off a series of stunning saves to help preserve the visitors lead.

Liverpool's revival suffered a blip as they were held to a 1-1 draw at Wigan. The Reds looked to be on course for a fourth consecutive league victory after Fernando Torres slotted his fourth goal in as many games after seven min-Chelsea's delight at victory utes at the DW Stadium.

But Wigan came back into the match and netted a deserved equaliser early in the second half when Hugo Rodallega steered in a low shot from 10 yards.

After their superb away victory over Arsenal, Newcastle were brought crashing down to earth in a 2-1 home defeat by Blackburn.

Morten Gamst Pedersen fired Rovers ahead after only three minutes before Newcastle got back on level terms through in-form striker Andy Carroll, who enhanced his claims for a place in England manager Fabio Capello's next squad with a well-taken equaliser two minutes after half-time.

Second half substitute Jason Roberts then slotted the winner eight minutes from time as Rovers' former Newcastle boss Sam Allardyce made it a happy return to St James Park.

## HK end long wait

Defending champions Qatar edged past Gulf neighbours Kuwait 2-0 to make the last 16 at the Asian Games on Thursday as Hong Kong ended a 52-year Guangzhougoso wait to qualify for the knockout rounds.

Qatar, who looked to be in deep trouble when they trailed India 1-0 with 11 minutes left on Tuesday, ensured they finished top of Group D with a 31st minute strike from Hatim Abdelaziz and another by Ahmad Abdil deep in injury time.

Kuwait still went through as the second placed team, while India stunned Singapore 4-1 to keep their hopes alive of qualifying as one of the four best-placed teams finishing third.

The Indians put Singapore on the back foot with 13 minutes gone when Jewel Raja Shaikh got the opener. The floodgates opened in the second half,

with further goals from Jibon Singh Khangeman, Singh Balwant and Maithani Minish before the Young Lions got a late consolation.
