



Tougher law for stalkers

The government has decided to amend the Women and Children Repression Prevention Act, 2003 to make sure it is enforced vigorously in fighting stalking.


The decision came yesterday at an inter-ministerial meeting on framing a law against stalking, said meeting sources. Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid chaired the meet at the education ministry.

It was decided that the section 10 of Women and Children Repression Act, 2003 would be amended and for this it will be placed before cabinet.

No timeframe for the amendment could be known immediately.

Section 10 states if any male, in order to satisfy his carnal desires, touches the sexual or any other organs of any woman or child with any organ of his body or with any other object, his action will amount to sexual abuse. Or, if he abuses the modesty SEE PAGE 15 COL 6

8 power contracts get go-ahead

Local, foreign companies to set up the plants with 1,235MW capacity

The Cabinet purchase committee yesterday approved awarding eight contracts to different local and foreign companies to build power plants and generate 1,235 megawatts of power using natural gas and furnace oil.

The eight deals include three private projects being awarded through competitive bidding. These would come into operation between 2012 and 2013. The remaining five rental electricity generation projects--awarded through unsolicited negotiations--are expected to be launched by the next lean season.

The first three are major ones and among them two are being awarded to local company Summit along with its US partner GE.

The purchase committee approved awarding two large power projects to Summit that won both the tenders by submitting the lowest prices. The two are: Meghnaghat 335MW dualfuel project and the Bibiyana Phase-2 340MW

combined cycle gas-fired project. Earlier, Summit won the Bibiyana Phase-1 340MW gas-fired power project.

Summit bagged the Bibiyana Phase-2 by offering a levelised rate of US 3.397 cents per

11 held over 'suicide blasts'

The police detained 11 people yesterday with links to Saturday's bomb blasts at the house of ruling party lawmaker Afaz Uddin at Taragunia in Kushtia.

Meanwhile, Ejaz Ahmed Mamun, son of Awami League lawmaker from Kushtia-1, filed two cases -- one for possession of explosives and the other for murder -- against eight people in connection with the bomb attack that left three people dead and two others injured.

"The evidence indicates that it was a suicide bomb attack. Both the attackers were killed in the incident," said Inspector Jahid Hossain of Daulatpur Police Station.

Police identified the two attackers as Siddiqur Rahman, son of Bhaddar Ali of Chakdaulatpur village, and his cousin Ahadul Islam, son of Tara Chand of the same village.
