Dhaka rivers to get lifeline

Tk 945cr project work starts next month to keep them flowing round-the-year

Water in the capital's river system -- the Buriganga, Turag, Balu and Shitalakkhya rivers -- will flow unceasingly in three years, said Humayun Kabir, chief engineer (central) of Water Development Board.

of Tk 945 crore Buriganga River Restoration Star. Project, in which about 62 kilometres of New Dhaleshwari, Pungli, Bangshi and Turag rivers in the upstream would be dredged to restore the ceaseless flow with the Jamuna.

A stretch of 162.5 kilometres between Dhaka and New Dhaleshwari offtake, almost half a kilometre downstream of the Bangabandhu

Bridge, would be restored to maintain flow in the river system of the capital round the year.

"We have floated tender for the first-phase dredging of 62 kilometres and hope to start the work by December 11 this year and complete it in three years. The government has already given Tk 80 crore for the project," Humayun The inspiring news came with the launching Kabir, also the project director, told The Daily

> The idea is to keep the branching point of the New Dhaleshwari flowing round the year and divert at least 245 cubic metres of water per second into the city's river system. A sluice gate would be built at the Jamuna confluence to contain floods, which will ensure water flow SEE PAGE 15 COL 1

Eid-ul-Azha, one of the two major religious festivals of the Muslims, was celebrated across the country on Wednesday amid religious fervour, spirit of sacrifice and

festivity. Affluent Muslims celebrated the day by sacrificing animals in remembrance of the sacrifice of Hazrat Ibrahim (AS), who was instructed by almighty Allah to give up his dearest son Hazrat Ismail (AS)

in a test of faith. Most families sacrificed goats or bulls, although some wealthier families slaughtered dumbas and camels. The sacrificial meat was shared with relatives and the poor.

Eid prayers were held at mosques and Eidgahs in the capital and elsewhere in the country.

Crackers thrown into CJ's house

Jubo Dal, JCD chiefs among 5 sued

Police yesterday filed a case implicating four leaders of the main opposition and a son of an opposition leader in Thursday night's Molotov cocktail explosions in the chief justice's official residential compound, according to a senior officer of the Ramna Division of Dhaka Metropolitan Police.

Ramna Police Station Officer-in-Charge Shibli Noman however did not confirm that the five were implicated in the case.

Two Molotov cocktails exploded on the premises of the official residence of Chief Justice ABM Khairul Haque in the capital's Kakrail area on Thursday night after those were hurled into the compound.

Ramna police filed the case in the first hour of yesterday implicating Moazzem Hossain Alal, president of main opposition BNP's youth front Jatiyatabadi Jubo Dal; Habib-un-Nobi Khan Sohel, president of the party's volunteers' front Jatiyatabadi Swechchhasebak Dal; Barrister Nasir Uddin Asim, BNP chairperson's human rights affairs secretary; Sultan Salauddin Tuku, president of BNP-backed student organisation Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal; and Akhter Hamid Paban, son of BNP Secretary General Khandakar Delwar Hossain, said the senior officer of DMP Ramna Division.

On condition of anonymity, the senior police official said many others might also be implicated in the case later, following SEE PAGE 7 COL 1

Highways turn into death traps during Eid holidays STAR REPORT

At least 45 people were killed and scores of others were injured in road accidents across the country during the Eid holidays.

In Pabna, five people were killed and 30 injured when a bus plunged into a roadside ditch at Baokola in Atgharia upazila Thursday.

The deceased are Shafiqul Islam Mintu, 25, conductor Aloke Chandra, 36, Nirmala Ribennu, 60, Nargis Khatun, 35, and her daughter Anita, 16.

The bus heading towards Ishwardi from Bhangura fell into the ditch around 9:00am after the driver lost control over the steering wheel, our correspondent reports from Pabna.

Three people died on the spot while two others died in a hospital.

Our staff correspondent in Bogra reports: Five people died when a bus rearended a number of motorbikes at Silimpur in Bogra town Thursday night.

The deceased are: Nafis, 25, Masud Rana, 27, Israfil, 23, Wazed Hossain Bappi,

23, and Lalin, 22.

Sub-Inspector Nazrul Islam of Shaheed Ziaur Rahman Medical College and Hospital police outpost said the accident happened around 11:00pm when a bus heading for Thakurgaon hit the motorbikes.

Five of the riders died on the spot while the others sustained minor injuries, he added.

Police seized the bus but its driver managed to flee the scene.

In Comilla, five people were killed and 15 injured when a bus collided with a microbus at Kalakochua in Burichong upazila on Eid day. The identity of the deceased could not be known, UNB Local sources said the microbus head-

ing for Laxmipur and the bus going towards Daudkandi collided on Dhaka-Chittagong Highway leaving the five microbus passengers dead on the spot around 5:30pm.

Eight bus passengers and seven other

microbus passengers were also hurt. The injured were admitted to different local hospitals.

Our Kishoreganj correspondent reports: At least four people were killed and three others injured on Kishoreganj-Bhairab Highway at Achmita in Katiadi upazila Thursday. Police and locals said the accident

happened around noon when a bus heading for Bhairab collided head-on with a pick-up truck, killing school-goer Jalal Uddin, 14, on the spot. Six injured of the pick-up were rushed

to Bazitpur Zahirul Islam Medical College Hospital in critical condition where driver Md Shahabuddin, 22, Jyotsna Begum, 26, and an unidentified woman aged around 30, succumbed to their injuries. In Magura, three people, including a

couple, were killed when a bus rammed a human haulier on Magura-Jhenidah Highway at Sachani around 4:00am Wednesday.

Driver of the human haulier Obaidul and passengers Zafar Biswas, 60, and his wife Rabeya Khatun, 50, died on the spot, reports our Magura correspondent.

The Bangladesh women's cricket team made sure that the national anthem would be played in the 16th Asian Games in Guangzhou despite their ten-wicket defeat to Pakistan in the final yesterday.

The silver medal was confirmed for Bangladesh when they raced to a comfortable nine-wicket win over China to reach the women's Twenty20 cricket final at the Asian Games on Thursday.

The victory in the semifinal handed Bangladesh their first medal of the Guangzhou Games in an otherwise disappointing performance in the other disciplines.

Bangladesh's dream of making history was dashed when they were bundled out for a mere 92.

Stalkers kill elderly man on Eid day

Attacked after he protested harassment of his granddaughter

Stalkers strangled an elderly person for protesting the harassment of his granddaughter on Eid day in Kurigram.

The victim, Abdus Sobhan, 74, of Noleya village under Bhurungamari upazila of the district, was killed by two local youths, Mostafa, 20, and Ripon, 24, said Sobhan's family members and villagers. The incident happened Wednesday morning when he protested stalking of his granddaughter Rujina Akhter Rupa, a student of Kishaloya Bidya Niketon, near their house.

Police arrested Mostafa's father Nur Islam and Ripon's mother Rahima Khatun and is hunting the two killers.
