## Killing of two protested

#### Police say deceased innocent

Several hundred people staged a demonstration at Kanchpura Bazar of Uttar Khan in the city on Saturday night protesting the killing of two people and injuring of six others, suspected to be robbers, in a mob beating on Thursday night.

The half kilometer long procession from Kanchpura Bazar to Betli area lasted for about an hour from 9:00pm, also protesting the arrest of six people in connection with the incident.

The deceased are Arzu Miah, 30 and Sirajul Islam, 30. Dakkhin Keraniganj police said locals chased and severely beat up a gang of alleged robbers gathering at Polashpur Ferryghat area

near Abdullahpur to commit robbery. Sirajul's brother Abdul Motaleb told this correspondent yesterday that 111 people, all relatives residing in the same area, went there in search of a truck that was stolen two days before Eid from Kanchpura Bazar of Uttarkhan in the city.

Arzu's brother Ambar Ali, 48, injured in the incident and now in jail, is the owner of the truck.

Motaleb said they heard from a source that a truck was seen abandoned in a bush at Palashpur Ferryghat area and went there in a microbus in search of it.

Locals suspected them to be robbers and beat them. When Arzu was killed, locals put sharp weapons inside the microbus and filed a case against them on charges of attempted robbery, he added. Motaleb said another lost truck was found in the same area

around 15 days ago. A local gang of carjackers may have carried out the theft and instigated the mob, he suspects. Officer-in-Charge Nazmul Islam of Uttarkhan Police Station

said on hearing the incident, they conducted an investigation and found that the victims went there in search of a lost truck. The victims were known as innocent people in the locality, the

OC added. OC Abul Bashar of Dakkhin Keraniganj Police Station said

they sent six of the injured to jail. Police filed a murder case in connection with the incident.

The families of the victims are yet to file any case.

OC Bashar said police are yet to unearth the mystery behind the incident.

### US lauds Bangladesh for religious freedom

The US Department of State has appreciated recent success of Bangladesh in religious freedom that includes ensuring constitutional rights for publicity of religions.

The appreciation came in a report titled 'International Religious Freedom-2010' placed in the US Congress on November 17, said a message received here.

US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton formally unveiled the report, which was prepared in the light of section 102 (B) of the International Religious Freedom Act.

The report focused on the success including appointments of a good number of minorities to important administrative and political posts.

The success also includes setting up training centres for religious leaders, creating environment for observing religious festivals and playing role in reducing violence on religious minority.

Declaring Fifth Amendment to the Constitution unconstitutional is among the major decisions by the Bangladesh Supreme Court, said the report.

The report also highlighted the situations of religious freedom of 198 countries during the period from July 2009 to June

# 12 killed in road accidents

At least 12 people were killed and 18 others injured in separate road accidents in Gazipur, Bogra, Chittagong and Munshiganj on Saturday night and yesterday.

UNB from Gazipur reports: Five people were killed and 14 others injured in a head-on collision between a pickup van and a human hauler on Dhaka-Tangail highway at Kodda under Sadar upazila in Gazipur yesterday.

The deceased were identified as Ruhul Amin, 35, a resident of Konabari in Gazipur, his wife Manjuna, 26, Shamim, 22, Rafiq, 22, and Raju, 28, of Lalmonirhat district.

The Joydevpur Chourasta-bound human hauler from Chandra in Kaliakoir upazila collided with the pickup van coming from opposite direction at about 6:00am, leaving Manjuna dead and 14 injured, police quoting witnesses said.

The injured were rushed to Gazipur Sadar Hospital where Shamim, Rafiq,

Ruhul Amin and Raju succumbed to their injuries. Injured Oli, 8, and Tanbir, 6, sons of Ruhul Amin were shifted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital as their condition deteriorated.

Other injured were identified as Ashraful, 33, and Saiful, 26, of Kurigram, Shanta, 25, Nasrin, 26, Laili, 24, Yasmin, 20, Shahidul, 30, Jewel, 22, of Gazipur.

Police sent the bodies to the hospital morgue for autopsy and also seized the two vehicles.

Our correspondent from Bogra adds: Three people were killed and four others injured when a Thakurgaonbound bus from Dhaka carrying nearly five to six passengers fell into the Karatoya river breaking railing of a bridge at Mahasthangarh in Shibganj upazila in Bogra around 11:00pm on Saturday.

Abu Mokaddem Ali of Shibganj police said they suspected that the driver of the bus might have lost his control over the steering that caused the accident.

One of the deceased was identified as Nazrul Islam, 37, a staff of Opsonin Pharma Limited. Identity of two others could not be known immediately.

Firefighters rescued the bodies and sent those to Shaheed Ziaur Rahman Medical College for autopsy. In another road accident in

Sariakandi upazila of Bogra, a person named Rafiqul Islam succumbed to his injuries at the hospital nearly six hours after a shallow-engine driven vehicle carrying him turned turtle around 3:00pm on Saturday.

A correspondent from Chittagong reports: One person was killed in an accident at Fataybad of Hathajari upazila in Chittagong yesterday.

Police identified the deceased as Jaynal Abedin, 30, a pickup van driver.

Mohammed Kasem, officer-incharge of Hathazari Police Station, said the accident took place when Joynal's pickup van collided head-on with a loaded truck, which was going to Khagrachhori from Chittagong city. He said after the accident relatives

Shakhawat Hossain, officer-incharge of Shreenagar Police Station, said the accident occurred when a Dhaka-bound passenger bus ran over Jahirul while he was crossing the road in the afternoon.

In another accident a motorcyclist was killed when a bus hit him on Dhaka-Mawa highway at KC Road intersection of the district yesterday morning.

The deceased was identified as Mizanur Rahman, 48.

However, the bus fled the spot immediately after the accident.

diplomats and Japanese journalists attended the ceremony. "The DAJA competition is a


unique opportunity to highlight the significant contribution of journalism and individual journalists to the development process in Asia," said Masahiro Kawai, dean and CEO of ADBI.
