Genie cure by quack leads to boy's death

A child who was set afire by a quack for treatment died at Dhaka Medical College Hospital yesterday after fighting for life for 34 days.

Seven-year-old Fazle Rabbi of Bagmara in Rajshahi, who had neurological problems, was taken to local quack Abdul Wahed. The quack told his guardians the boy was caught by a genie and needed a 'fire treatment' to drive it away.

On October 20 midnight Wahed set Rabbi on fire to "oust the genie living inside him and causing severe headache".

Promotion spree to see more OSDs

The government is set to promote officers to the posts of deputy secretaries, additional secretaries and secretaries even though there are no vacancies, further increasing the number of officers on special duty (OSD).

Sources said these officers could be stuck as OSDs for months since the government will face difficulties in posting them.

Currently, there are 126 additional secretaries against 108 posts, 408 joint secretaries against 355 posts and 1,330 deputy secretaries against 830 posts.

Sources say that there are around 400 OSD officers in the ministry. At least 158 were made OSDs after being promoted to joint secretaries Sunday.

Promotion without vacant posts at various levels left many officers without work. Many did not get new responsibilities after promotions and remained in the same position. Sources said this is causing stagnation at work and frustration among them.

Stampede kills 375 in Cambodia

Cambodia searched for answers yesterday a day after a stampede killed at least 375 people on a suspension bridge where survivors said they were wedged into the crowd of living and dead for hours.

The government launched an investigation into why thousands panicked late on Monday on the pedestrian bridge connecting Phnom Penh to an island where mostly young people celebrated the last day of a festival marking the end of the rainy season

Survivors recounted scenes of mass suffocation and desperate screams after thousands went into a frenzy to flee the bridge, apparently after shouts went up that some people had been electrocuted. Police said some also shouted that the bridge was about to collapse.

The victims suffocated or were trampled and some survivors said they were wedged into the crowd for hours. Police sprayed water so survivors could drink. About 755 people were injured.

"People were shouting that someone had been electrocuted, to run back," Touch Loch, 18, told Reuters. "I fell and people stepped on

me until I passed out. When I woke I was here in hospital."

"People were crying for their fathers and mothers.

Phay Siphan, a government spokesman, denied anyone was electrocuted on the bridge, which was adorned with flashing lights. He said it was designed to sway, but the movement took pedestrians by surprise and some shouted it was broken.

"The cause was panic, not electrocution," he told reporters who gathered in front of the bridge, which was littered with shoes and clothing left by victims.

Khon Sros, 19, said from her hospital bed some people had leapt off the bridge to escape but she had been pinned in the crowd from her waist down until police pulled her out.

"One man died near me. He was weak and didn't have enough air."

Touch Theara, 38, said she had been stuck in the crowd for three hours: "I thought I was dead ... Police sprayed water at us. We were just opening our mouths to drink."
