S Korea boosts defences

North warns of more strikes; South's defence minister quits

South Korea said yesterday it would send more troops and guns to frontline islands, as North Korea warned it could follow up this week's in years, with the international community deadly shelling with more attacks.

Pyongyang's fresh warning came as a US aircraft carrier headed for the tense peninsula to join war games to be staged as a show of force to the nuclear-armed communist state.

The North's unprecedented artillery bombardment of Yeonpyeong island on Tuesday killed two marines and two civilians, injured 18 more people and turned homes into charred ruins.

It claimed its first political victim when the South's Defence Minister Kim Tae-Young resigned, following growing criticism that Seoul's military and government reacted too softly to the assault.

The government said yesterday it would revise its rules of engagement, allowing troops to hit back harder if necessary.

Tuesday's attack was the first time the North had shelled a civilian area since the 1950-53 war. It provoked the worst crisis on the peninsula

agonising over how to respond. South Korea and the United States, among others, pressed China to rein in its neighbour. The North accused the United States and its

"warmongering South Korean puppets" of provoking the attack. It said South Korea's military in an exercise fired shells within what the North claims as its own waters.

The regime said that if the South commits "another reckless military provocation, our army will carry out second and third rounds of powerful physical retaliatory strikes without hesitation".

Cambodia holds day of mourning

Crowds of mourners offered flowers and incense yesterday at the site of a stampede that killed almost 350 people after panic spread over rumours an overcrowded bridge was about to collapse.

Prime Minister Hun Sen, dressed in black, wiped away a tear and burnt incense at the foot of the narrow bridge, as he led the country in a national day of mourning at a short service.

Flowers and food offerings for the souls of the deceased replaced the shoes, clothing and plastic bottles that were discarded by victims and had remained as grim reminders of Monday's disaster.

Officials said throngs of revellers celebrating the nation's annual water festival apparently panicked as rumours rippled through the crowds that the crossing to an island in Phnom Penh was about to give way.

Diminished strength Mr Obama's remarks came three weeks after his acknowledged "shellacking" in the mid-term elections.

Mr Obama's Democratic party lost control of the House of Representatives and

saw its strength in the Senate diminished, threatening the president's ability to enact his legislative agenda.

Asked to comment on Tuesday's military clash between North and South Korea, Mr Obama told ABC: "South Korea is our ally, it has been since the Korean War, and we strongly affirm our commitment to defend South Korea as part of that alliance."

He said he would not speculate about a military response but said he would consult with South Korean President Lee Myung-bak on the matter.

On Wednesday morning, the US deployed an aircraft carrier fleet to Korean waters to join South Korean forces in military exercises.

Maliki named Iraq PM for second term

Nuri al-Maliki called for unity among Iraq's factions yesterday after he was named for a second term as prime minister, signalling an end may be in sight to an eight-month political impasse.

President Jalal Talabani's nomination of Maliki, delayed to give him as much time as possible to negotiate ministerial posts, comes after a power-sharing deal between Iraq's divided factions was sealed two weeks ago.

It gives Maliki 30 days to complete the difficult task of forming a cabinet.

The months-long tussle has seen Iraq shatter the world record for the longest period without a new government after

"I charge you ... Nuri al-Maliki to form the new government, which we hope will be a real national partnership government which will not exclude any faction," Talabani said at a ceremony at Al-Salam presidential palace in Baghdad.

"You have 30 days to form the cabinet."

Following his nomination, Maliki called for political blocs to present "qualified and honest" candidates for ministerial posts and urged Iraqis to support the security forces as they fight a still present insurgent threat.

"I call for all the Iraqi people, the sects, my political brothers, to work hard to move past all our disputes, to put them behind us, and open a new page based on cooperation," he said.

"Let our goal be serving Iraq, not serving enemies, blocs, nationalities or sects -let this be our main goal."

The United States is concerned about a big dumping of classified documents by WikiLeaks which is expected to included diplomatic cables, State Department spokesman Philip Crowley said Wednesday.

"We are gearing up for the worst-case scenario, that leaked cables will touch on a wide range of issues and countries," Crowley told AFP.

The spokesman added that "we've known all along that WikiLeaks has in its possession State Department cables."

"We are prepared if this upcoming tranche of documents includes State Department cables. We are in touch with our posts around the world. They have begun the process of informing governments that a release of documents is possible in the near future," Crowley said. He said that diplomatic cables, messages

between US posts around the world, "involve discussions that we had with government officials, with private citizens."

"Inherent in this day-to-day action is trust that we can convey our perspectives to other governments in confidence," he said. Breaking that confidence "has a impact."

"These revelations... are going to create tensions on our relationships between our diplomats and our friends around the world," he said.

Pentagon spokesman Colonel Dave Lapan said that US officials were expecting a possible release of documents "late this week or early next week." "I'm not going to talk specifics but I would

say that even though they are believed to be

State Department documents, classified cables, there are some that contain DoD (Department of Defense) related issues. WikiLeaks has not said what will be contained in its coming release, indicating only

that it will be "seven times" the Iraq War logs in which it posted 400,000 secret documents. A new posting would mark WikiLeaks' third

mass release of classified documents after it published 77,000 secret US files on the Afghan conflict in July. WikiLeaks argues the release of the docu-

ments, US-soldier authored incident reports from 2004 to 2009, has shed light on the wars, including allegations of torture by Iraqi forces and reports that suggested 15,000 additional civilian deaths in Iraq.
