### Ctg bourse to upgrade trading system

Chittagong Stock Exchange (CSE) will upgrade its web-based trading system to provide faster and wider services.

The bourse yesterday signed a contract with two software firms for implementing its next generation web-based trading system (NGTS) to offer better performance of its trading activities.

The CSE signed the deal with Sri Lankan Millennium IT and Indian Polaris Software Lab at the CSE conference room.

Ahmed said the NGTS is the world's fastest order processing system through which as many as 2,250 trade orders could be received in a second, while in the old system the number was only 50.

The new system will execute 750 contracts per second, while the existing system can execute four, he said.

The NGTS has multi channel order submission system with real time risk management that would ensure maximum flexibility of the brokers and their clients to trade from anywhere using CSE President Fakhor Uddin Ali intranet, internet and mobile phone,

said the CSE president. The system was successfully imple-

mented in Turquoise and London Stock Exchange, Ahmed added. The Millennium IT, founded in 1996 in

Sri Lanka, is a wholly owned subsidiary of London Stock Exchange, and would implement the NGTS project in association with Polaris Software Lab Limited, said the CSE officials. Millennium IT would provide the

'exchange' solution with a robust coretrading engine, while Polaris would offer the 'brokers' solution of this project, they said.

### Gaibandha job generation Massive onion scheme impacts the poor

The government's special 40-day employment generation programme has created positive impact to the poor of Sundarganja upazila in the district this lean period.

According to the Upazila Relief Office, 3337 poor people, including women, aged between 18 and 60 years have been engaged as workers with 45 projects worth Tk 2 crore.

Of the total, some 253 workers have been involved in Bamondanga union, 204 in Sonaroy union, Shantiram union and Sarbanonda union each, 220 in Tarapur union, 193 in Belka union, 258 in Dahaband Union, 230 in Ramjibon Union, 223 in Dhopadanga union, 233 in Chhaparhati union, 233 in Horipur union, 215 in Kanchibari union and Sreepur unions each, 210 in Chandipur union and 242 in Kapasia union.

M. Shamsul Azam, upazila nirbahi officer, said the programme will continue up to December 30 when the harvest of T-Aman paddy starts in full swing, to create job opportunities The project works include construction for the day- and farm-labourers sufficiently.

### output targeted

BSS, Rangpur

The government has fixed a massive target of producing 14.40 lakh tonnes of onion from 1,60,000 hectares of land this Robi season, officials and experts said yesterday.

Of them, 84,528 tonnes of onion will be produced from 9,392 hectares of land in all eight districts under Rangpur Agriculture Zone and farmers have already started farming the essential spicy crop.

The Department of Agriculture Extension has fixed a yield rate of 9 tonnes onion a hectare on an average throughout the country.

Meanwhile, the early variety onion has already appeared in the local markets keeping its prices reasonable now, although seeds sowing has been continuing in full swing everywhere in the country's northern region, according to the DAE.

DAE, BARI, BADC, commercial banks and Rajshahi Krishi Unnayan Bank (Rakub) and a large number of nongovernmental organisations have taken adequate steps to make such onion farming a success.

The steps include distribution of quality seeds, disbursements of easy-term farm loans at 2 percent interest rates, providing trainings, technical assistances and inputs under various programmes. Onion import will be reduced in future, as its production

continues increasing due to the new impetuous being given to the sector and the crop is being cultivated twice a year in place of only once during the winter in the past, experts said. Besides, growers have been showing more interests in

farming onion following disbursements of easy-term agriloans at only two percent interest rates and easier availability of the high quality seeds everywhere. A huge amount of allocated agri-loans for increased farm-

ing of spices remained idle with banks in the past, but presently the same is being disbursed on larger scale among farmers this time.

Onion will be cultivated in 1,672 hectares of land in Rangpur, 1,527 in Gaibandha, 456 in Lalmonirhat, 1,456 in Nilphamari, 640 in Kurigram, 2,154 in Dinajpur, 557 in Thakurgaon and 930 hectares in Panchagarh districts.

### **BP sells stake in Pan American Energy to Bridas**

BP said Sunday it has agreed to sell its 60 percent stake in Pan American Energy to Argentina-based oil and gas firm Bridas Corporation, as part of asset sales to pay for the Gulf of Mexico oil spill.

The 7.06-billion-dollar (5.33-billioneuro) sale, which British energy group BP expects to complete next year, will give ness of the assets throughout BP's global Bridas total ownership of Pan American, the second largest producer of oil and gas in Argentina.

Bridas is owned 50 percent by Cnooc International, the international arm of China National Offshore Oil Company, and 50 percent by Bridas Energy Holdings, which is owned by Argentina's Bulgheroni family.

In a statement, BP said the deal was part of its plan to divest up to 30 billion dollars of assets by the end of 2011 to cover costs incurred during the devastating oil spill at a BP rig in the United States earlier this year.

It has so far raised 14 billion dollars from asset sales, before the Pan American deal. BP group chief executive Bob Dudley

said: "Today's agreement further demonstrates both the high quality and attractiveportfolio and also the company's ability to meet our significant financial commitments arising from the Gulf of Mexico tragedy.

"We now have agreements in place that should secure the majority of our divestment target.

"We will continue to identify further assets that may be strategically more valuable to others than to BP as we complete the programme."
