Encourage more investment in Bangladesh

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday requested her Japanese counterpart Naoto Kan to encourage Japanese investment in Bangladesh and relocate their not-soprofitable industries to her country.

Hasina said Japanese investors can invest more in Bangladesh, as the country is investment-friendly and now being considered the

second most profitable economy in South Asia. Hasina, at an official banquet, said more investments can also significantly help to reduce the trade deficit -- Bangladeshi imports now amount to over a billion dollar as against exports of US\$ 330 million to Japan.

Naoto Kan hosted the banquet in honour of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at Prime Minister's Office (PMO) in Tokyo.

Sheikh Hasina stressed on a comprehensive economic partnership agreement between Bangladesh and Japan for reaping mutual benefits by exploiting the untapped potentials of the two countries as well as reducing huge trade imbalance.

She sought more Japanese cooperation in Bangladesh's quest for a "Digital Bangladesh" and for graduating it to a middle-income country by fulfilling the government's Vision-2021.

The PM said her government began implementing policies ensuring a sound macroeconomic stability, comfortable foreign reserve, and an excellent business climate.

Both Dhaka and Tokyo are committed to international peace and security, counterterrorism, prevention of nuclear proliferation, elimination of weapons of mass destruction, and management of global climate change issues, she said.

She observed that the common views on most issues of mutual concern, goodwill, understanding and complementarities naturally lead the two countries to a strategic part-

nership, which would promote global peace. Hasina assured that Bangladesh will extend its wholehearted support to the rightful claim of Japan for a permanent seat in an expanded





Addressing the launch of the workshop, Rizvi said the present government is putting special emphasis, among others, on counter-terrorism efforts, which however is not enough.

The counter-terrorism strategy should be such that the terrorists have no scope to operate within Bangladesh, he said.

Referring to partnership between the civilians and the military during the War of Liberation, Rizvi said relation-

ship between the civilians and the military is of immense importance,

possible through dialogues. US South and Central Asian Affairs Deputy Assistant Secretary of State Alyssa Ayres appreciated Bangladesh's efforts against terrorism and militancy.

The US puts special emphasis on cooperation with Bangladesh in combating terrorism, food security and climate change and this will continue, she said.

US Ambassador to Bangladesh James F Moriarty said framing a counter-terrorism strategy to ensure national security is an urgent task.

There is no scope for complacency in only arresting some criminals, said

Moriarty, adding that attention should be put to improving human living standards so that people cannot opt for terrorism.

The US is committed to work with Bangladesh in rooting out militancy, Moriarty said, adding that authorities should not lapse concentration on the issue.

DIRI Programme Coordinator John Hansen spoke on the programme while

BEI President Farooq Sobhan chaired it. Four papers, two each from Bangladesh and US, are scheduled to be presented at the workshop on which participants will discuss different aspects of developing a national counter-terrorism strategy.

Dipjol lands in jail

A Dhaka court yesterday sent Dhaka City Corporation ward councillor and film actor Monwar Hossain Dipjol to jail in connection with a case filed against him for assaulting a traffic police constable on November 16 in the city's Gabtoli area.

Metropolitan Magistrate SK Tofail Hassan passed the order after Sub-Inspector Nazmul Huda Khan, also the investigation officer (IO) of the case, produced him before it at 3:30pm.

The court also fixed December 1 for hearing a five-day remand prayer and directed jail authorities to produce the accused before it on schedule.

In the forwarding report, the IO mentioned that Dipjol was directly involved with assaulting Aftab Uddin while he was on duty. The law enforcer came under attack as he protested violation of traffic rules by the DCC ward councillor. Following the incident the accused

and his accomplices fled the scene. A dozen cases filed against him are pending with different courts, said the IO, adding he needs to be remanded to gather vital clues about the incident and know the whereabouts of his accomplices.

After hearing both the sides, the magistrate passed the order.

JS body recommends warrant instead of issuing arrest

A parliamentary body yesterday agreed in principle to recommend passage of the bill to issue only a warrant instead of issuing an arrest warrant for publishing or broadcasting any misleading news.

The law minister earlier placed the bill titled 'Code of Criminal Procedures, 1898 (amendment) act 2010' which was sent to the parliamentary standing committee on law, justice and parliamentary affairs ministry for scrutiny.

Meanwhile, the body yesterday also asked the Supreme Court registrar to

appear before the committee's next meeting to clarify the alleged irregularities in appointing the Dhaka District and

"It was alleged that the Dhaka district and sessions judge was appointed superseding a number of judges. The committee will seek clarification from the SC registrar on the issue," Suranjit Sengupta, chief of the committee, told reporters emerging from the meeting at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban. About amendment of the bill, he said,

"For the sake of flourishing of democracy and to give more rights to journalists, the committee in principle agreed to place the bill in parliament with that provision."

"But the committee will sit with the leaders of Press Club, Dhaka Reporters Unity and Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists and Dhaka Union of Journalists on December 5 to share their views on the provision of the bill before making final recommendations," added Suranjit, also an AL senior lawmaker.

The committee members said once the proposed bill is passed, country's image will brighten and the world media will also welcome the government for not issuing arrest warrant against a journalist or editor or publisher of any print or other media for publishing any misleading news.
