Ashuganj transit deal signed

Power plant equipment to be carried to Tripura; effective till June 2012

Bangladesh yesterday signed the first ever multi-modal transit deal with India only for carrying equipment to a power plant in Tripura. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)

was signed by officials of the two countries at the shipping ministry in Dhaka. With this, Bangladesh implemented one of

the clauses of the 50-point Joint Communiqué issued on January 12 during Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's visit to India. India will not pay any fees or service charges

for this transit even though it will use Bangladesh's rivers and roads. However, it has agreed to provide Bangladesh Tk 25.50 crore for the development of Ashuganj river port terminal and 49 kilometres of roads.

India has been paying annual charge under

river protocol since 1972 and it will continue to do so. The charge has been raised to nearly Tk 5 crore a year since 2009 for five ports of call across Bangladesh.

Foreign ministry sources, however, said the MoU was signed without the foreign ministry's nod. An official of the ministry said under the Rules of Business, 1996, no other ministry can do anything unilaterally if the matter is related to foreign relations.

No foreign ministry official was present during the signing.

According to the MoU, Indian cargo will start from West Bengal's Raimongal and enter Bangladesh at Angtihara under Shaymnagar of Satkhira and go up to Ashuganj river port by inland waterways. The cargo will then be moved to Akhaura on very large lorries.

Stray clashes mark hartal

150 hurt, 200 held

With overwhelming presence of law enforcers and ruling Awami League activists on the streets, opposition BNP's dawn-to-dusk hartal yesterday passed without any major untoward incidents.

Top-ranking BNP leaders including most members of the . party's standing committee were not seen on the streets during the hartal. Even leaders like Salauddin Quader Chowdhury and . Moudud Ahmed, who were very vocal about enforcing the hartal, staved indoors.

The capital, however, saw less cars and passenger vehicles on : the streets with rickshaws dominating the thoroughfares due to

Koko indicted in absentia

Trial of money laundering case begins Jan 4; Saimon also accused

A Dhaka court yesterday framed charges against former prime minister Khaleda Zia's younger son Arafat Rahman Koko and a former BNP minister's son in absentia in a money laundering case.

The other accused is Ismail Hossain Saimon, son of former shipping minister late Akbar Hossain.

The same court on October 31 issued arrest warrant against Koko and Saimon in connection with the case. As per the law the accused were supposed to be present in the court at the time of hearing on the

charge framing and during the trial proceedings.

Judge Mozammel Hossain of the Special Judge's Court-3 fixed January 4, 2011 to start trial of this case through deposition

of 23 witnesses.

The court also framed charges against the duo in their absence, as Koko and Saimon did not appear before the court or were not produced by the police.

Koko, who was arrested on September 2, 2007 on graft charges and paroled for treatment abroad in July the next year, is now in Bangkok though his parole is not in effect.

Saimon has been on the run since the Anti-Corruption Commission filed the money laundering case against him and Koko on March 17 last year.

In the case statement, the anti-graft body said the accused had laundered money they received from China Harbour Engineering Company Ltd and Siemens for helping them win

AFTAB MURDER CASE RESTORED

Charge against prime accused Osman dropped

A trial court yesterday rescinded its earlier dismissal of businessman Aftabuddin killing case, and reinstated murder charges against 18 of the accused including top-listed gangsters Shahadat Hossain and Khorshed Alam.

Judge Mahbubur Rahman of the Environment Appeal Court revived the murder charges. He however upheld dropping of the charge against number one accused Osman Goni Sarkar, as the charge against him had been deemed politically motivated by the National Review Committee for Withdrawal of Politically Motivated Cases.

The same judge on October 3 had thrown away the entire case following a petition to do so from the public prosecutor (PP) on recommendation from the home ministry.

The law ministry on Monday moved to reinstate the murder case as its withdrawal drew a flurry of criticism, and asked Dhaka Metropolitan Public Prosecutor Abdullah Abu to file another petition for rescinding the dismissal order.

In his yesterday's order, the judge said the previous order was

erroneous. "So the court accepted the petition of the metropolitan public prosecutor to withdraw the earlier order." SEE PAGE 7 COL 4
