\$150m WB loan to create jobs for ultra poor

The World Bank (WB) yesterday approved a US \$150 million credit to Bangladesh to create employment opportunities for the extreme poor in rural areas during the lean and monga periods, said a WB press release.

According to the release, one-third of the job opportunities will benefit poor women. The country is home to 35 million people still in extreme poverty, it

"The WB highly prioritises the welltargeted and well-governed safety net programmes to reduce the vulnerability of the poor," said Ellen Goldstein, country director of World Bank Bangladesh.

"Together, the World Bank and the government are expected to create employment opportunities for approximately 200 million people over a threeyear period under this project."

The release said each year the project will run for 100 days, spanning two lean seasons -- one from October to December and the other from March to May -- when rural day labourers are often out of work.

Only households where the head is a manual labourer and which have less than half an acre of land will be eligible for the programme. Wages will be paid through formal financial channels to enhance transparency.

The "Employment Generation Program for the Poorest" will provide short-term employment to vulnerable households in extreme poverty, especially women. The project will support the ongoing programme of the government, which builds on previous successes.

"The project will target both the poorest upazilas and the poorest households," said Maitreyi Bordia Das, senior social protection specialist and task leader of the project.

"Poverty maps will be used to ensure effective targeting and resource allocation at upazila level. Further, the focus on women's employment is expected to have large positive impact on their empowerment."

37, out of 231, AIDS patients died in last one year: Health minister

Two hundred and thirty-one people were diagnosed with AIDS while 37 of them died in last one year in the country, Health Minister AFM Ruhul Haque has said.

He said 343 HIV positive patients were identified last year taking the total number of the affected to 2,088. The total number of AIDS patients in the country now stands at 850, he added.

The minister was speaking yesterday at a seminar organised by the National AIDS-STD Program (NASP) of the health ministry at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre (BICC) in the capital marking the World AIDS Day.

AKM Amir Hossain, additional secretary of the ministry, chaired the semi-

The minister in his speech highlighted various government efforts to prevent the

deadly disease including adopting the Bangladesh Labour Welfare Foundation national policy on HIV/AIDS and sexual diseases approved in 1997, and setting up of 146 safe blood transfusion centres across the country.

Led by Mojibur Rahman Fakir, state minister for health and family welfare, the health ministry also brought out a procession at Manik Mia Avenue to create mass awareness against the disease.

STD/AIDS Network of Bangladesh also brought out a procession in the capital and organised an exhibition at the BICC to create public awareness. The World Vision arranged a blood donation programme there. In 2009, 143 people were diagnosed



College girl 'commits suicide' in city

A college girl allegedly committed suicide by hanging herself from a ceiling fan at her North Shahjahanpur residence in the city yesterday.

The girl's family members said she committed suicide as she had been suffering from asthma for long.

The dead was identified as Sadia Bintey Nur, 17, a first year student at National Ideal School and College.

Neighbours told reporters that Sadia's father Nur Ahmed, an official of Bangladesh Bank knocked on her bedroom door after returning home completing his prayers at a nearby mosque early in the morning. They broke open the door

as Sadia did not respond and found her hanging from a ceiling fan, said a next-door neighbour seeking anonymity. They rushed her to Dhaka

Medical College and Hospital where doctors declared her dead, said the neighbours. During a visit to the house,

the flat of the deceased on the first floor of a six-storey building was found locked from outside while the neighbours said the body was taken to Jamalpur for burial from the hospital. Dhaka Medical College

Morgue sources said autopsy of the body was not done.

Officer-in-charge (OC) Toffazol Hossain of Motijheel Police Station said victim's father Nur Ahmed filed an unnatural death case with the police station.

He mentioned in the case statement that his daughter had been suffering from asthma for long and recently the condition deteriorated leading her to commit suicide.

UK, Australia to share same visa centre from Dec 5

UNB, Dhaka

The UK Border Agency and Australia's Department of Immigration and Citizenship will share the current UK visa application centres in Dhaka and Sylhet from December 5.

A British High Commission release says people to apply for UK and Australian visas will attend the same visa application centres located in ZN Tower, Gulshan Avenue, Dhaka and Garden Towers, Shahjalal Bridge Link Road, Mendhibagh, Sylhet.

The UK and Australia have agreed to share a number of visa application centres and biometric collection facilities worldwide, as Australia begins to collect biometric data from its visa applicants. Dhaka and Sylhet are the first locations where the facilities will be

According to the release, the way customers for UK visa submit their visa applications and biometrics at the visa application centres will remain unchanged. No change will occur also in the process by which the UK Border Agency makes decisions on all UK visa applications.

The customers' biometric and personal data will not be shared as part of this initiative. The information of UK visa applicants and Australia visa applicants will be stored and processed completely separately. British High Commissioner Stephen

Evans said more people can now enjoy the visa application facilities. "We remain committed to continuing an efficient and high standard visa service for all our customers in Bangladesh."
