Kidney donation after death can save 30,000 lives

Say experts

Some 30,000 lives could be saved if people start donating kidneys after their deaths, said experts at the 6th national conference of Kidney Foundation held in the city yesterday.

They said every year around 1.80 lakh people are diagnosed with kidney diseases in the country. Of them, 40,000 suffer from kidney failure while three fourth of them die as the people are still reluctant to donate kidneys.

Like eye donation after deaths, people can start donating kidneys. In developed countries, around 85 percent kidney is collected from the deceased donors and the success rate at this type of kidney transplantation is also high, they mentioned.

The Kidney Foundation has been trying to save lives of people with the kidneys collected

from the deceased donors for last two years, the organisers said.

But due to lack of donors and apathy of the people for lack of awareness it cannot move forward much, they told the conference at the Convention Hall of the Kidney Foundation Hospital and Research Institute.

President of the foundation Prof Dr Harun ar Rashid presided over the conference while Health Adviser to the Prime Minister Syed Modasser Ali was present as the chief guest. National Professor MR Khan was present as

the special guest. Secretary General of the foundation Dr Muhibur Rahman, Vice President Dr MA Wahab and Managing Director Tini Ferdous Rashid also spoke.

Around 300 nephrologist, urologist and transplant experts took part in the conference.

Accountability and transparency at all levels of governance are crucial to prevent corruption in the society, said anticorruption activists at a debate competition in the city yesterday.

Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB) organised the two-day shadow parliamentary debate competition on Environment and Corruption at Brac University to mark the International Corruption Day on December 9.

Corruption will engulf the issues of environment in absence of transparency and accountability, as it involves water, forests and mineral resources, said Dr Iftekharuzzaman, executive director of TIB, at the inaugural session.

Corruption occurs in different man-

ners at different levels of the society with abuse of power, absence of accountability, transparency, enforcement of law and

institutional weaknesses, he said. Incorporating tolerance to and accommodating other's views in exercising democracy is essential for the success of democratic politics, said Iftekhar adding that it would be easy to prevent corrup-

an organisational position, without taking direct benefit, is even a kind of corruption, said Dr Malik, also an eminent lawyer of

the Supreme Court. However, he said, by the time today's

youths take on professional life in next one decade, a tangible progress will take place in the society in preventing corruption.

"In fact, the corruption itself has prompted the society to react and resist the menace," he said.

Over 300 university debaters from across the country are taking part in the competition at Brac University and East West University.

TIB event has been funded by UNDP with The Daily Star, ABC Radio and private television channel Bangla Vision as media partners.

'WikiLeaks puts US diplomacy in embarrassing state'


