The Agartala visa office, set up ladesh's deputy high commission in 1974 and upgraded in 1990, is the only Bangladesh mission in northeast India.

EPB now seeks export targets from overseas missions

The Export Promotion Bureau has taken an innovative plan to seek export target from the country's missions abroad instead of the earlier goal fixed by the authorities concerned.

In doing so, the EPB will send a letter to the foreign affairs ministry to take necessary steps so that all the 44 Bangladesh missions can fulfill the export targets.

Out of the total missions, 21 achieved their respective export targets, while 23 could not do so during July-September of the current fiscal year, according to the latest statistics from the state-run

promotional agency.

"We'll seek suggestions from the missions about the measures and mechanisms needed for boosting export and device ways and means accordingly," Jalal Ahmed, vicechairman of EPB, told the news agency on Wednesday.

From now on, Jalal said, his organisation and the foreign ministry will work jointly to increase export trade.

Efforts will be made to increase the export volume by synchronisng economic and diplomatic relations, he said.


The EPB top official described Brussels, Russia, Turkey and Korea

as potential export destinations for Bangladeshi products.

Readymade garment (RMG) share in export is gradually decreasing and has stood at 77.10 percent this year from 80 percent earlier, he said, adding: "It means that shares of other goods like software and shipbuilding are on the rise."

Commerce ministry sources said a \$18.5 billion export earning target was fixed for the fiscal 2010-11 with a forecast of achieving 14.20 percent export growth.

The actual export earnings in the first quarter of the fiscal was \$5029.05 million, which is 12.33 percent higher than the target of \$4477.00 million.

"The anti-graft law, now in place, is flawed and weak, which has made elimination of corruption a task next to impossible," Mahiuddin Khan Alamgir, chairman of the parliamentary standing committee on public accounts, told the discussion.
