
### AL questions BNP's hartal support

## Symbolic start to drive

The crackdown against overhead Internet and cable TV wires on city thoroughfares began yesterday with cables from a pole at Karwan Bazar removed.

## Follow rule

Asks govt; admission won't be allowed after September in private universities with temporary campus

The private universities, which failed to start educational activities at their permanent campuses as yet, will not be allowed to enrol new students from October next year.

Once the period is over, they will not be permitted to publish advertisement for enrolling students, Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid said announcing the government decision at a press conference yesterday.

Students pursuing education in these institutions and those to be enrolled before next September, however, will be allowed to complete their ongoing courses, he added.

The education ministry arranged the conference in its conference room to inform its decision regarding implementation

# Sugarcane sale through SMS

New system introduced for govt mills

UNB, Dhaka

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has called upon entrepreneurs to invest more in agro-based and other small and medium industries.

Hasina made the remarks when she inaugurated a digitised 'e-purji' system at her office yesterday.

E-purji system -- jointly implemented by prime ministers officerun Access to Information programme (A2I) and UNDP -- is the issuance of permit through Short Message Service (SMS) to the growers for selling sugarcane to the 15 state-owned sugar mills.
