Police reject Change law to protect migrant workers' cause Speakers tell consultation

With changing problems in overseas recruitment system, it has become imperative to amend the Emigration Ordinance 1982 to bring discipline in the sector, said speakers at a consultation yesterday.

They said migrant workers want security of their family, land and properties they leave behind and so domestic laws should be framed in a way that protects interests of the wage earners.

The observations came at the programme titled "Reform of Emigration Ordinance 1982 and Migration Policy" organised by Refugee and Migratory Movements Research Unit (RMMRU) of Dhaka University at Sonargaon hotel in the city.

Addressing a session, expatriates' welfare Secretary Dr Zafar Ahmed Khan said it is very hard to bring the recruiting agencies to book for any wrongdoing under the existing laws and judicial system, which ultimately puts the migrant workers' rights at risk.

About the reform in the ordinance, Dr Zafar said it should be reformed as problem patterns

of the expatriates and migrant workers are changing.

"But in the context of Bangladesh, many interest groups play a vital role during the formulation of a law for which sometimes it becomes impossible to enact tough laws," he said at the concluding session of the daylong programme.

Chairing the session, Law Commission Acting Chairman Dr M Shah Alam said ways should be found out to protect the rights of the migrant workers who send home annually US \$10 billion plus remittance, a lifeline for the country's economy.

RMMRU Chair Prof Tasneem Siddiqui presented the outcomes of the consultation.

She said the migration policy-2006 has a lot of good things for the expatriates, but the government is yet to frame any action plan to implement the policy.

Prof CR Abrar, coordinator of RMMRU, Prof Asif Nazrul of Dhaka University, Begum Shamsun Nahar, joint secretary of the Ministry of Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment, also spoke at the consultation.

not exempted from paying income tax

Gulshan Club would have to pay income tax and submit tax return to National Board of Revenue (NBR) as a High Court bench yesterday rejected its writ petition.

The Gulshan Club authorities in Dhaka sought direction from this court on the National Board of Revenue (NBR) to exempt the club from paying income tax and filing tax return.

An HC bench of Justice Mc Ashfaqul Islam and Justice SM Emdadul Hoque came up with the verdict after hearing counsels for both sides of the petition.

The Gulshan Club authorities are now liable to pay income tax and submit tax return to NBR following the HC verdict, Additional Attorney General Murad Reza told The Daily Star.

The club authorities filed the writ petition on February 12 this year claiming that this club is a limited company by guarantee without any share capital and a non-profit making organisation.

The club is not liable to pay income tax and to file tax return to NBR, the petition

HC on April 8 direct the NBR authorities to exempt Gulshan Club from filing tax return and issued a rule upon the authorities concerned to explain why they should not be directed to declare Gulshan Club a limited company and to exempt it from filing tax return.

The SC on April 20 stayed the HC direction and asked both sides of the petition to dispose of the rule after hearing at the HC.

Barrister Masood R Sobhan and Barrister Fatema S Chowdhury appeared for the petitioner.

JUTE MILL FIRE

4 top staff arrested

Police arrested four top officials of Abdul Latif Bawani Jute Mill of city's Demra early yesterday suspecting their involvement in a fire incident that gutted three godowns of the mill Sunday night. The arrestees are Enamul Haque, general manager, Ziaur

Rahman, deputy general manager, Mir Mosharraf Hossain, assistant manager and security officer Shahidul Islam. Officer-in-Charge of Demra Police Station Nurul Muttakin said

police arrested them following an allegation from the mill workers that the fire incident was pre-planned. Police would interrogate them, he added. On that night, mill workers brought out a procession demanding proper investigation into the incident and exemplary punishment to the persons responsible.

Three of four go-downs of the jute mill were gutted in the blaze. The first godown caught fire around 8:30pm and soon engulfed two others adjacent to it. Over 50,000 mounds of jute were burned to ashes, said Enamul

Haque, general manager of the jute mill, on Sunday night.

Abdur Rashid, deputy director of Fire Service and Civil Defence, told The Daily Star yesterday the roof of a godown had

collapsed and walls and roofs of two other godowns were partially damaged in the blaze. Five units of firemen were working at the spot to dump burnt out stuff of the godowns. It could take a whole day to finish the job, Rashid added.

Workers said another fire broke out in a godown on Wednesday but could not damage the stored jute as the fire fighters managed to douse the fire. The mill authority has formed a five-member committee to probe the matter. The jute ministry also formed a four-member committee in this regard.
