26 killed in factory fire

100 injured; reason behind blaze at Ha-Meem unit not confirmed

At least 26 people were killed and 100 more injured when a fire swept through Ha-Meem Group's sportswear factory at Narsinghapur in Ashulia yesterday.

Of the deceased, three suffocated while the rest died falling from the 11-storey factory trying to escape the inferno.

The identities of those killed could not be confirmed as of filing this report at 2:15am.

The fire started in the finishing section on the ninth floor around 1:00pm. Most of around 5,000 workers of the factory were out for lunch at that time, Lt Col (retired) Delwar Hossain, deputy general manager of Ha-Meem Group, told The Daily Star. After efforts for over seven hours, firefighters doused the

flames around 8:30pm, said Brig Gen Abu Nayeem Mohammed Shahidullah, director general of Fire Service and Civil Defence. It took time to put out the fire because of fabrics inside the

factory, he added. Police, Rapid Action Battalion and army personnel helped the firefighters bring the situation under control.

Trapped in smoke

Ha-Meem Group garment workers could not reach firefighting equipment to douse the blaze, as chocking smoke clouded their vision.

A number of injured workers said this to reporters at different city hospitals and clinics where they were under treatment.

Mokbul, a 32-year-old worker from Bogra, said they tried to come out of the building but could not see the stairs

due to the coiling smoke. "There was smoke on the ninth floor where the fire originated, and the tenth floor

where the canteen is located," **SEE PAGE 15 COL 3**

236 doctors hired illegally, says HC

The High Court yesterday declared illegal appointment of 236 medical officers at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU).

The bench of Justice Mohammad Momtazuddin Ahmed and Justice Gobinda Chandra Tagore passed the order on a writ

petition challenging the legality of the appointments, which were given in December 2005.

The court said the notification of the appointments by the then BSMMU registrar was issued without lawful authority.
