Akij goes green

Akij Group quietly went green seven months ago by setting up a 12megawatt biomass thermal power plant costing more than Tk 10 crore.

The group is using the power in several of its factories at Munshiganj, saving the company a portion of the money being spent for gas and electricity.

"We are saving Tk 30-40 lakh a ity. month by using the energy of our plant," said Sk Bashir Uddin, managing director of Akij Group.

"We found that solid waste generated by our particle board mills could be a vital raw material for biomass power," Bashir Uddin told The Daily Star. "We hired Chinese and Singaporean consultants, and set up the plant."

Electricity and gas crisis is a burning issue for industries in Bangladesh. Shortages have forced many factories to run on furnace oil and diesel, which cost five and ten times more respectively, than gas.

Yunus builds social business fund with Japan agency

Grameen Bank is creating a social business fund in Bangladesh in collaboration with a Japanese agency, said the bank's founder Muhammad Yunus on Friday.

"We are talking with a Japanese agency for creation of a social business fund so that young people could create social business models in the country," Yunus said during a videoconferencing session organised by the Indian Institute of Management in Ahmedabad, Gujarat.

Multinationals such as Adidas have approached Grameen Bank to develop social business models, he added.

"We have proposed to create a Grameen Adidas model, where the challenge for the company is to make shoes for under one euro [Tk 93.6]. We are testmarketing it in Bangladesh so that people do not walk barefoot, "Yunus said.

"The effort is to create social business models which should be sustainable in themselves, "Yunus said.




The CNG station owners said one of the their main demands is still unresolved as they have been forced to keep their stations closed from 3pm to 9pm daily since August 16.
