Knit owners urged to follow new pay scale

The leaders of Bangladesh Knitwear Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BKMEA) yesterday urged the owners of garment and knitwear factories to follow the new pay scale announced by the government.

They also called for forming a participatory committee comprising both the owners and workers' representatives at all the factories to solve the workers' problems in order to avoid any unrest.

They were speaking at a meet-

ing with the factory owners on productivity, new pay structure, and prospects of the knit sector at the conference room of Chittagong Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCCI).

BKMEA acting president Mohammad Hatem chaired the meeting, where Senior Social Compliance Officer Md Mijanur Rahman presented a keynote on 'New Minimum Wage Structure: Implementation and its Importance'.

Rahman said the factory owners should not curtail any existing additional facilities the work-

ers have been enjoying from before while implementing the new pay scale.

Hatem said BKMEA is working for the capacity building of its member factories through implementing modern management and setting production strategy.

He urged the factory owners to become more conscious about maintaining compliance, the implementation of the new pay structure and enhancement of the workers' efficiency.

BKMEA Vice President (Finance) AH Aslam Sani said Ban-

gladesh is now the second biggest knitwear exporter in the world.

He emphasised ensuring compliance and implementing the new pay scale in the knitwear factories to become the number one in knitwear export.

Sani said the workers in Vietnam and China are getting minimum wage of \$47 and \$200 per month, while the Bangladesh government has set the amount at around \$45.

CCCI President MA Latif MP blamed the recent workers' unrest on some wrong steps taken by some owners at differ-

ent factories in Chittagong Export Processing Zone while implementing the new pay scale.

BKMEA Director and also the Managing Director of Four H Group Gouhar Siraj Jamil urged the knit sector leaders to discuss with the government the issues such as the shortage of gas, electricity and raw materials.

CCCI Vice President SM Shafiul Hoque, directors SM Salauddin, Golam Zakaria Bhuiyan, Md Humayun Kabir Khan Shilpi and Md Syed Hossain Sarker, and former director Showkat Osman also spoke.

Govt, WB sign \$150m credit deal

The government signed a \$150 million credit agreement with the World Bank (WB) for a three-year programme yesterday to create employment for the poor in rural areas.

The programme will address seasonal poverty by allowing the poorest to earn, and can be scaled up if the situation demands, the WB said in a statement.

The programme -- the Employment Generation Program for the Poorest -- will target both the poorest upazilas and households, and is expected to create 200 million person-days of employment over a three-year period, it added. M Musharraf Hossain Bhuiyan, secretary of Eco-

nomic Relations Division (ERD), and Ellen Goldstein, country director for the World Bank, signed the deal in Dhaka. "The government is committed to extend the

safety-net to protect the poorest and the vulnerable population while ensuring an efficient, accountable and transparent system," Bhuiyan said.

"Wages to the day-labourers will be paid through formal financial channels to ensure the efficiency and transparency," he added. The programme will benefit the day-labourers,

the lean season, and ensure that at least one-third of those employed are women, said the officials. "Our mandate is to reduce poverty, and this requires shared growth in which the poorest are not left behind," said Goldstein. "The World Bank will provide

especially women, who are often out of work during

funding for wage-earners, but will also ensure that funds are well-targeted to those who need it most." The programme will run for 100 days each year, spanning over two lean seasons: one from October

to December and another from March to May., when rural day-labourers are out of work.
