Russia-India sign nuke, defence deals

Russian President Dmitry Medvedev has signed nuclear and defence agreements worth billions of dollars during a two-day visit to India.

He has met Indian PM Manmohan Singh in Delhi on a trip that saw handshakes on the joint development of a so-called fifth generation stealth fighter jet.

There was also an agreement to supply more Russian nuclear power reactors.

All five permanent UN Security Council members have now made trade-focused visits to India in recent months.

A Cold War ally and for many years the default weapons supplier to India, Russia has faced tough competition from Europe and the US for a slice of Delhi's booming defence market.

Wary of its rising regional rival, China, India is now one of the world's largest buyers of fighter jets, tanks, submarines and other

defence equipment. As Medvedev and Singh met yesterday,

nearly a dozen agreements were signed in such areas as energy, technology and chemicals.

Russian President Dmitry Medvedev's visit to India looks set to seal a variety of deals, notably SEE PAGE 19 COL 7

Global forums ignore impacts on agriculture

Agriculture has not been given enough priority in the global forums on climate change although it is the most vulnerable sector, said environment experts, economists and journalists at a discussion yesterday.

They said intrusion of saline water and irregular cycle of seasons due to global warming would seriously affect farm production putting lives at stake. It is imperative that Bangladesh puts special emphasis on agriculture in climate change negotiations.

The observations came at a workshop on "climate change effects on Bangladesh agriculture and threats to food security" organised by Forum for Information Dissemination on Agriculture (FIDA) at the Jatiya Press Club.

Agronomist Mahabub Hossain said the government does not seem committed enough to address the climate change issues. "The politicians assume power for five years. So they are more for short term plans rather than that of 50 or 100 years'," he added.


