Judiciary may collapse for pending cases: Shafique

Law Minister Shafique Ahmed yesterday said the sheer number of cases which are now on trial or pending in the courts may cause the whole judiciary system to collapse.

According to sources at the Supreme Court, there are nearly 16 lakh cases pending in different lower courts across the country. Among them, over nine lakh are criminal cases and seven lakh are civil cases.

"It would be better if most problems are solved mutually outside the court," he said, "One benefit of mutual negotiation is that both parties would gain something from it and if the case goes to the court there will be only one winner."

The law minister said told the National Workshop on Children Justice System in Bangladesh organized jointly by Save the Children and Children Justice Network (CJN) at BIAM Auditorium in the city.

Mutual negotiation is more applicable in the case of children held for criminal offences, said the minister.

The police should consult the community and family members to solve the problem instead of bringing formal charges, he said.

"Children lack the maturity to express their opinions, understand their rights or know how to practice them, and therefore they need a separate justice system," said Barrister Imman Ali of the High Court

Division of the Supreme Court.

"This goes on to show that many of our police officials, magistrates or judges are not fully aware of the 1974 law," Kazi Rezaul Hoque, permanent member of National Human Rights Commission.

Executive Director of Centre for Development Communication Muhammad Jahangir moderated the programme while Country Director of Save The Children UK Suman Sengupta was in the chair.

Child Protection Specialist of Unicef Md Aminul Islam and CID & NPD, PRP Additional Inspector General Md Mokhlesur Rahman, among others, also spoke.

Vaccine can prevent 97pc cervical cancer 'Amend CHT land law' Says study

Cervical cancer can be prevented in 97 percent cases if adolescents are vaccinated with human papilloma virus (HPV) before their sexual exposure, a study revealed yesterday.

The research found HPV vaccine highly effective in immunising people against the cancer that kills 18 women a day across the country.

Bangladesh Cervical Cancer Vaccination Programme Committee (BCCVP) and Oncology Club conducted the pilot study on "Prevention of cervical cancer by HPV vaccination in Bangladesh".

Funded by Grameenphone Ltd, the pilot scheme was carried out over 50 underprivileged girls aged between 13

and 19 of Dhaka and its outskirts from December 2008 to July 2009.

After vaccinating all the girls with three doses of HPV, their bodies were found to have developed antibody against cervical cancer. "It indicates they will have almost no

chance to develop cervical cancer afterwards," said gynecologist Prof Dr Sameena Chowdhury of Central Hospital. "The research, however, is still in

progress to find out if the vaccine would work for lifetime," she added. Experts at a city hotel seminar yes-

terday said 6,561 deaths from the cancer are reported every year against an estimated 12,931 cases in the country.

First verdict likely on January 15-20

The verdict in a mutiny case filed against 111 BDR jawans of Record Wing at Pilkhana headquarters in the city is likely to be pronounced between January 15 and 20 next year.


After the end of the proceeding of the BDR Special Court-9, prosecutor of the case Lt Col Mizanur Rahman yesterday said it would be the first verdict against any battalion under Dhaka sector headquarters.

Ten witnesses gave their depositions before the special court on Thursday while 44 accused cross-examined them.

Earlier, the prosecutor introduced 46 witnesses before the court. On the 9th day of the proceeding, he added two more witnesses who gave depositions against two of the 111 accused.

The special court, headed by BDR Sector Commander of Dhaka, Col Habibul Karim, started the trial at about 9:15am, which continued till 1:30pm.

Habibul asked the accused to prepare to produce arguments and for self-defence on the next proceeding day and adjourned the court till 10:00am of December 27.

Demand indigenous leaders

Members of the indigenous community yesterday demanded amendment to the Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) Land Dispute Resolution Commission Act to resolve problems in the CHT region.

They also reiterated their demand for the resignation of the chairman of the CHT Land Commission as he takes decisions without consulting members of the commission.

They alleged that CHT Land Commission Chairman Khademul Islam Chowdhury has taken up some decisions, which go against the CHT peace accord. The demands were made at a discussion titled 'Land dispute

in CHT and Land Dispute Resolution Commission Act' at the National Press Club in the city. Speaking as the chief guest, Justice Gholam Rabbani said a

separate law should be formulated to resolve land disputes in He also suggested forming an indigenous academy that

would work to connect cultures of Bangalees with indigenous communities. Presenting the keynote paper, Mangal Kumar Chakma said a

high level committee decided there were 23 contradictory provisions in the CHT Land law that should be amended. The committee also decided to remove the chairman of the

commission but both decisions were not implemented, he added. Mangal also alleged that the commission chairman is conducting its activities unilaterally.

Though the law was passed in 2001, the land dispute resolving rules were not formulated yet, he said, suggesting on doing so.

Shamsul Huda, executive director of Association for Land Reform and Development, and Swapan Adnan, member of International CHT Commission, also spoke.

The meeting was jointly organised by Khagrachhari District Headman Association, Kapeng Foundation, Chittagong Hill Tracts Forest and Land Rights Movement and Parbatya Chattagram Nagorik Committee.

Chahla Prue Jemi and Gautam Dewan also addressed the meeting.
